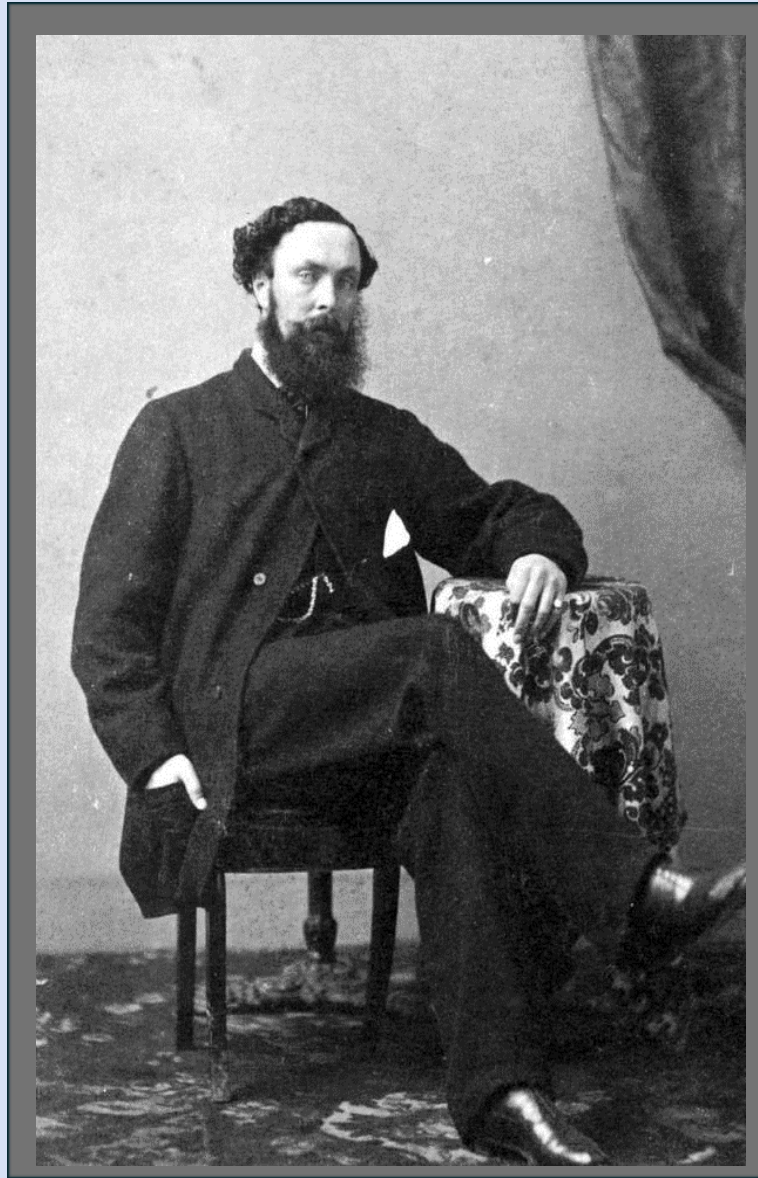

FOREWORD

Peter O'Reilly's 1877 diary has been voluntarily transcribed for informational purposes only. Researchers interested in this diary are advised to consult the original document housed at the Royal British Columbia Museum & Archives, found in MS-2894, the O'Reilly family fonds.

TRANSCRIPTION NOTES

Each year's transcription includes a brief diary summary for each month. A reference and comments section is also provided to identify people, places, events, or things mentioned in the diaries. Comments, where provided, are discretionary and are given when it appears helpful to the understanding of the diary contents. The existence of a reference or comment within the diary is indicated by an asterisk beside the diary date. Multiple asterisks indicate multiple references or comments for the same date.

Square brackets are used to denote transcriptionist comments. Best guesses of words or phrases appearing in the text are enclosed in square brackets and not italicized, while functional comments about the text are italicized. The following are examples of functional comments.

- [*illegible*] – a word cannot be read.
- [*deletion*] – a strikethrough cannot be read.
- [*no entry*] – no entry in the diary for that date.
- [*left blank*] – a space reserved for text entry.
- [*overwritten text*] – text written over the top of other text.
- [*loss*] – text that is too faint to read.
- [*missing*] – microfilmed diary does not contain that date.

Spelling inconsistency is commonly found and is usually not corrected from the original, however, letters are occasionally inserted in square brackets to clarify the understanding of an otherwise misspelled word.

Deleted words and sentences are included and struck through where legible.

Frank O'Reilly's departure for England to attend school.
November 9-10, 1877

November . FRIDAY 9 1877

Took the dear little man to town to buy some things for him - went again in the boat & at his particular request inspected Joe Smith's foundation & paid \$200 to town acct to defray bank's expenses for trials. Also got draft on London for £400 in favor of E.W.J. to meet the expense of bank's outfit on his arrival in England. = Mr. Charles & Mr. Ward & other children came to lunch & to help carry. Drove Miss Alice, & Kelly to Esquimaux & went on board the Alasca to collect a letter for Frank, he went with Kelly for a pull in the boat. - I will sleep

SATURDAY, 10

A stormy night. Clouds low & threatening. Departure of Frank arrived at 10 o'clock with much to do we started at 11. Alice remained with Jack = a good many on board to say good bye to the traveller. Miss Mrs. Richards & Mr. Morgan Towle. Lindley & our dear little man, he behaved well. The sea parted over & they left at 1 1/4 P.M. I soon returned the Capt. Considering it too threatening to proceed. went on board again & remained till 5 1/2. When we again said our long good bye to our darling boy. - Glad that he & family go together - May God watch over them

DIARY SUMMARY

JANUARY

Peter O'Reilly as a member of the church synod executive meets with lawyers and the bishop regarding the removal of Rev Thomas Blunden from his pastoral duties – receives dividends from the Victoria Gas Company and Loan Investment Society – holds court at New Westminster.

FEBRUARY

A visit to the Ross Bay Cemetery to see the grave of Charlotte Trutch and Mary O'Reilly – executive meeting of the synod – court in New Westminster.

MARCH

An angry discussion takes place regarding paying Rev Blunden to leave the province – Peter gives evidence to a committee investigating the Indian reserves at "Sooyoos" (Osoyoos).

APRIL

Court at Lytton, Ashcroft, Kamloops, and New Westminster – Peter responds to an urgent request from the Hudson's Bay Company which results in placing two Indians in jail – Judge Matthew Begbie informs Peter of the loss of compensation for judges while travelling.

MAY

Clement Cornwall stays with the O'Reilly's in Victoria for several days – Peter attends police court in Victoria – frequent croquet games – court in New Westminster.

JUNE

Synod executive committee gives \$200 to Rev Blunden to enable him to leave the diocese – Tom Ellis pays interest on the \$7500 loan from Peter – court at Yale and New Westminster.

JULY

Peter buys six tons of hay harvested from Fairfield – attends Victoria Gas Co meeting and receives a share dividend – reelected to the synod executive committee – court at New Westminster, Yale, and Lytton.

AUGUST

Death of Sir James Douglas – court at Kamloops and New Westminster – robbery at Point Ellice – bird hunting on several occasions – Peter takes his son Frank hunting.

SEPTEMBER

Three weeks of work commences on building a cellar and repairing the foundation – consultation about altering the dining room – hunting at the North Dairy farm – court at New Westminster.

OCTOBER

A cook and house maid quit within a week, another house maid quits after one day – at Point Ellice steps are rebuilt at house – carpenters and masons continue to work on the cellar and foundation – court held at Lytton, Ashcroft, Kamloops, New Westminster – Peter goes bird hunting while traveling between court locations.

NOVEMBER

11-year-old Frank O'Reilly and 10-year-old Lindley Crease escorted by Arthur Vowell depart Victoria to attend school in England – one year anniversary of the death of Mary O'Reilly – death of Mrs Bulkley – court at Yale, Lytton, Ashcroft.

DECEMBER

Court at Kamloops – steamer *Reliance* strikes a rock and sinks, and Peter finds a canoe to take him to New Westminster to hold court – Frank arrives at Liverpool – after the death of his wife Thomas Bulkley auctions his belongings and departs Victoria sailing to England with his children.

MONDAY

Slight rain during the night,
A lovely day mild & calm.
Fanny Saunders left.
Remained at home all day.
Ward paid us a visit & reported
Mrs Ward much better, but decided
but he decided to leave the children
with us a few days longer
John Zoe & Miss Musgrave dined
with us - spent a very quiet evening

Very fine day worked at front
walk all the day.

Willy Pinder married to Miss
Devereux. -
Rained incessantly all day
John paid us a visit - remained

Mrs Thomson. Frank took 3 br. to Sir M. B. B.

Fine day - slightly overcast
Church at St John Revd Jenns
Officiated. Walked with Carry Frank & Puss

1877-01-08

MONDAY

Rained heavily all day. Settled with
Bryant in respect to horse "Archie" - paid
him \$30 fr past services, & agreed to pay \$25-
additional if horse is sound by 1st March
Also paid him \$13- in full for blacksmiths
work
Walked to town had a talk with Ward & Mc
Creight in reference to the Bishop & Blundin
Drake & Drummond nominated fr mayor.

1877-01-09

TUESDAY

Rained heavily most of the day.
Went to town, & had a consultation
with McCreight Ward & Drake in re
the proposed withdrawal of Revd Blundins
license, after which had an interview
with in Bishop on the Subject when
very strong opinions were expressed.

1877-01-10

WEDNESDAY

A most lovely day. Remained
at home worked in garden.
C. Good called to say good bye
he leaves tomorrow for six months
bound for England.
John paid us a visit.
Wrote to J.W.T. Puss also sent him
a birthday card & letter.

1877-01-11

THURSDAY

C Good sailed for Frisco in the Dakota in route to England Attended Executive meeting of the Synod - which ended in a row. Ward gave notice that he would move that after 31st March no further supplies should be granted to the Revd Gribbell - the Bishop refused to put the motion & the meeting broke up. McCreight dined with us.

1877-01-12

FRIDAY

Fine day. ~~Attended Directors~~ Attended meeting of Directors of Gas Company, no quorum - went to town had a talk with Robertson & Ward, afterwards with Charles. - Mrs Harvey & Mrs Drake Called. Mrs Eckersley left at a moments notice - at the ins[is]tance of her husband. John paid us a visit

1877-01-13

SATURDAY

Fine day. Sent apples to Mrs Jenns Mrs Charles, Mrs Ward & Mrs Grey - by Murphy - the Express man. Mrs Jenns called.

1877-01-14

SUNDAY

Rained heavily during the night. Cold raw day. Walked to St Johns with Carry & the children - took Jack with us for the first time. Frank ignited a match Revd Jenns officiated. Sir M. B. Begbie & Ward called.

1877-01-15

MONDAY

Very stormy night - rained all the Day. Attended Directors & general meeting of Gas Company - declared a div. at the rate of 9- pr cent per annum. Recd Dividend for self \$317-25

“ Walker 101-25

Paid the above sums into Bank to their respective accts. Walked with Begbie to see his house - paid Hamley a visit at Custom House.

Rained incessantly all day remained at home, made up C. C. accts. John paid us a short visit & informed us that Winter had been discharged by Mr Richards.

WEDNESDAY

Cold blustry day. In town had a chat with Vernon & Elliott Drew \$70-00 from Treasury my expenses holding Courts of Appeal in Westminster district - Assessment act 1876. Carry walked to Mrs Wards with Frank & Jack on pony. Drove her home in pony carriage.

1877-01-18

THURSDAY

Cold stormy day. Attended general meeting of the Loan Invest-ment society. Recd dividend at the rate of 11- pr cent.

for Self \$216.65

“ Hare 50.00

Pd the above into Bank to their respective accts.

Recd fr Graham C. C. accts fr Sept Octr Nov & Decr \$572 = \$788.63

1877-01-19

FRIDAY

Very hard frost. Still removed the stones from north side of house.

Remained at home.

1877-01-20

SATURDAY

Hard frost. Still & Son worked planted hedge of fir trees on north side of house. Went to town to see Robertson in reference to C. C's power of commitment. Walked home with Carry & Puss. Mrs Richards & Mrs Dupont called.

1877-01-21

SUNDAY

Hard frost. Carry Church at St Johns Revd Jenns officiated Carry Frank Puss & Jack. Ward paid us a long visit took a walk with him.

1877-02-22

MONDAY

Hard frost. Went to town paid a number of small bills Recd fr. Spratt \$125.00 = 15 months interest to 2nd decor - Saw Robertson & signed transfer of Farron Mortgage to Mrs Farron, principal \$500- interest due \$140 = \$640- upon payment by her of \$340 = the bal to remain on interest as before Paid Zoe a visit. John walked home with me.

1877-01-23

TUESDAY

Hard frost. Left Vic at 1 AM in OC Smooth passage arrived at Burrard Inlet at 4^{3/4}. Saw A Pinder for a few minutes. Reached N. W. at 6^{1/2} - in sleigh. Passengers by Otter Steve, J Robinson Holbrook &c Issued Guarnishes order to E Bevin in 3 cases

1877-01-24

WEDNESDAY

County Court N. Westminster 10 AM About a dozen unimportant cases to dispose of, did not finish till 5 P.M. Dined alone & retired to my room immediately.

1877-01-25

THURSDAY 25

Raining heavily all night & continued throughout the day. Heard a case between S. Herring & the Odd Fellows - in which \$175- was claimed for attending 2 children belonging to Fisk - decided as Arbitrator that \$82-50- be paid being at the rate of \$1.25 pr day each. Called on the Archdeacon Mrs Lowe & Mrs Tait.

1877-01-26

FRIDAY

Raining all the day. Enterprise arrived at 3 P.M. Recd letters from Carry, Frank & Puss. Capt. Lewis dined with me at the Colonial.

1877-01-27

SATURDAY

Left in Enterprise at 7- & arrived at Victoria at 2^{1/2}. Lovely day smooth passage. Frank & Puss met me on the wharf, Carry & Jack came as far as Spratts.

1877-01-28

SUNDAY

Lovely day. Church at St Johns - Revd Jenns officiated Carry remained to the Sacrament I walked home with Puss Frank & Jack. Ward paid us a long visit walked with him to Fort St & called to see the Charles's

1877-01-29

MONDAY

Most beautiful day. Still & his son worked. Allan Graham paid a long visit. Gregory came with a note fr Dupont. Evans came for trees fr Sir M. B. B. Mrs Thomson drove Carry to call on Mrs Ward. Puss spent the evening with the Drakes. Allan Graham paid us a visit

1877-01-30

TUESDAY

Sudden change in the weather
Rained heavily. Walked to town
Saw Dupont in reference to
his expenses to Kootenay
promised to write him a letter
in reference thereto.

Chinese New Year commenced
