FOREWORD

Peter O'Reilly's 1899 diary has been voluntarily transcribed for informational purposes only. Researchers interested in this diary are advised to consult the original document housed at the Royal British Columbia Museum & Archives, found in MS-2894, the O'Reilly family fonds.

TRANSCRIPTION NOTES

Each year's transcription includes a brief diary summary for each month. A reference and comments section is also provided to identify people, places, events, or things mentioned in the diaries. Comments, where provided, are discretionary and are given when it appears helpful to the understanding of the diary contents. The existence of a reference or comment within the diary is indicated by an asterisk beside the diary date. Multiple asterisks indicate multiple references or comments for the same date.

Square brackets are used to denote transcriptionist comments. Best guesses of words or phrases appearing in the text are enclosed in square brackets and not italicized, while functional comments about the text are italicized. The following are examples of functional comments.

- [*illegible*] – a word cannot be read.
- [*deletion*] – a strikethrough cannot be read.
- [*no entry*] – no entry in the diary for that date.
- [*left blank*] – a space reserved for text entry.
- [*overwritten text*] – text written over the top of other text.
- [*loss*] – text that is too faint to read.
- [*missing*] – microfilmed diary does not contain that date.

Spelling inconsistency is commonly found and is usually not corrected from the original, however, letters are occasionally inserted in square brackets to clarify the understanding of an otherwise misspelled word.

Deleted words and sentences are included and struck through where legible.

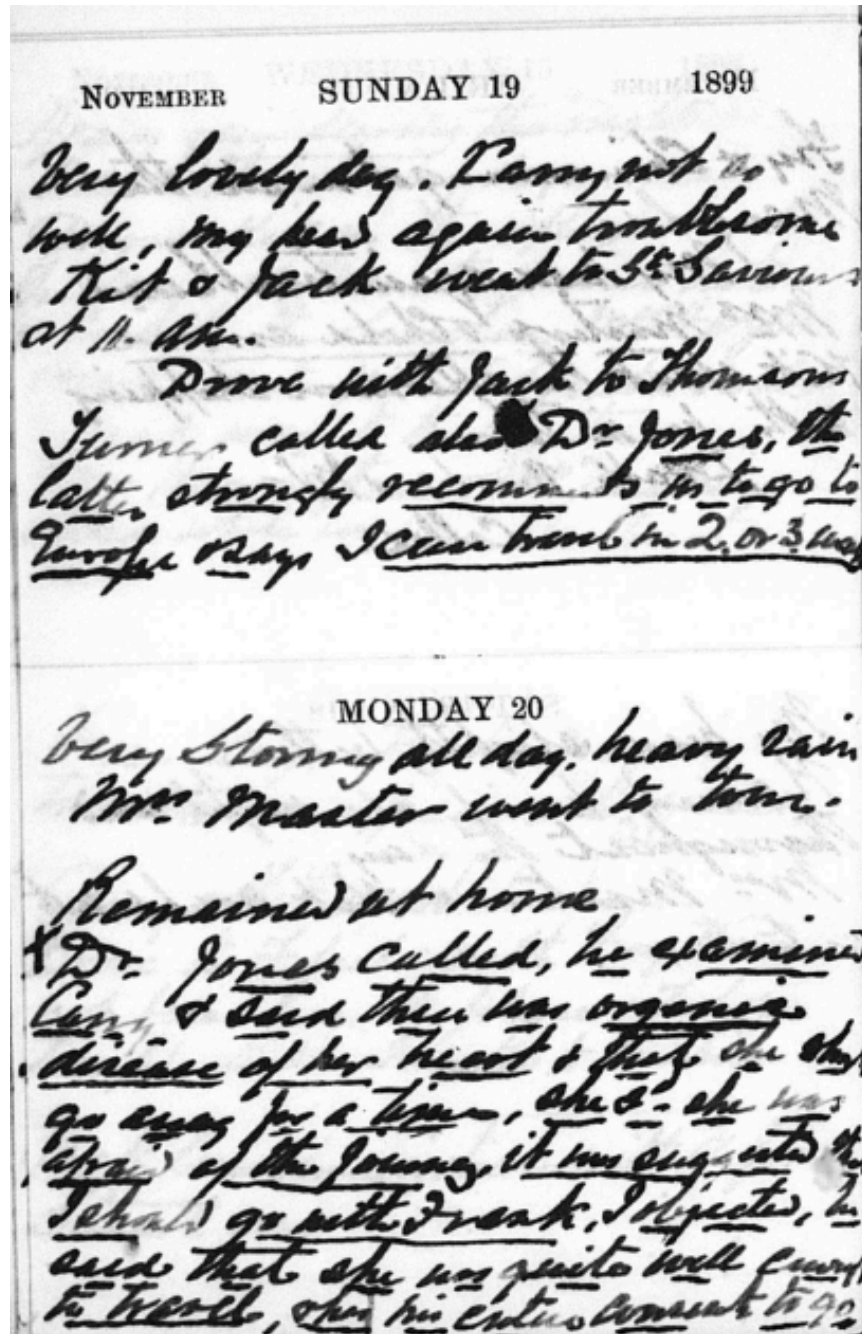

DIARY SUMMARY

JANUARY

Eighteen inches of snow on the ground on New Year's Day – Frank O'Reilly returns to Nelson and the West Kootenay area for his surveying work.

FEBRUARY

Peter O'Reilly continues his visits to the dentist and attends his usual director meetings – Kit and Jack O'Reilly play golf with friends and attend a tournament - "Carry very seriously ill during the night, great difficulty in breathing" - Dr Davie orders Carry O'Reilly to bed, "her heart is weak", and requires "rest & good diet & no excitement".

MARCH

Carry's condition is noted every day – Dr Davie visits and comments on her slight improvements – Peter and Carry have colds – friends come to inquire for Carry - Carry moves to the drawing room after five weeks in bed.

APRIL

Carry sits in chair outside for the first time, continues to have good nights and sleepless nights, receives visits from Dr Davie and friends – Peter's dentistry continues – Frank leaves for Nelson - death of Captain McCallum, Peter is a pall bearer at the funeral – HMS *Amphion* returns to Esquimalt - Peter meets with lawyer Aikman to deal with several property foreclosures – Carry alternates from cheerfulness to depression.

MAY

Peter suffers from back pain, unable to move, takes medicine which leaves him deaf, dizzy, and confused – Carry has some restful nights, but is still frequently "low spirited" and "greatly depressed" – Government House in Victoria burns down.

JUNE

Carry improves and is able to be taken for drives, but is still depressed – Carry has a falling out with Dr Davie, he suggests finding another physician – Peter pays taxes for Joseph and John Trutch's properties – Peter attends his usual board meetings.

JULY

Fairfield hay cut – Peter attends synod executive meeting - croquet played – Georgie Ellis and children from Penticton visit for several days.

AUGUST

Peter attends a tennis tournament – a vote is taken on building a Government St bridge and filling in the James Bay mudflats – Peter attends meetings of the Howe Sound Copper Co and the Esquimalt Water Works Co – HMS *Swiftsure*, *Warspite*, and *Amphion* make a return appearance at the naval dockyard – Peter suffers from headaches and ceases to write in his diary.

SEPTEMBER

No diary entries until late September – Peter goes for a drive with Kit but is very tired – Royal Marines return to England.

OCTOBER

Alterations to St Saviour's Church discussed – Carry and Kit attend church, shop, and go for drives – Temple Cornwall leaves for the Boer War in South Africa.

NOVEMBER

Dr Hanington states Carry does not have heart problems, but only "indigestion" - Fairfield caretaker Harding let go for poor performance and being drunk – Dr Jones recommends that Peter and Carry go to Europe – Dr Jones examines Carry and determines there is "organic disease of the heart" and consents to her traveling – Carry worried about traveling to England and can't make up her mind, her condition is poor.

DECEMBER

Peter requests Jack's salary be increased - Dr Jones does not take responsibility for saying that Carry can travel to England, then later gives his consent – Peter, Carry, and Kit depart and are joined by Frank – after a train trip to New York they board a ship to Liverpool, Carry's health continues to decline, she is "weaker & greatly depressed" – after arrival in Liverpool Carry is taken to a nursing home and passes away there, "A good & beloved woman went to her home" – burial at Cheriton near Folkestone with family members present.

1899-08-14

Lewis Anthony Beaumont

(1847-1922)

Rear-Admiral (1897), Commander-in-Chief of the Pacific Station (1899-1900) following Henry Palliser, knighted in 1901.

1899-08-21

comment

Peter O'Reilly had a history of debilitating headaches, and it appears that a severe headache starting about August 17th may have had such a significant effect on his health that it prevented him from writing in his diary again until September 25th.

1899-12-26

comment

Caroline "Carry" O'Reilly's burial took place next to the grave of her oldest sister Charlotte Barnes (Trutch) Davey (1823-1882) at St Martin's Churchyard in Cheriton, a suburb of Folkestone, England. In 1899 Folkestone was the home of Caroline's sister Emily White, Emily's daughter Caroline "Carry" Hare, and Carry Hare's children.

1899-12-26

Harry Vivian Hare

(1881-1914)

Third child and third son of Richard Hare and Caroline Acland (Pinder) Hare, killed in action during WWI in France.

1899-12-28

Eleanor Mary "Nelly" Hare

(1890-1978)

Fourth child and first daughter of Richard Hare and Caroline Acland (Pinder) Hare.

NOTES

I learned to admire, value & esteem the depth of her character, of her kindness, grace, gentleness & hospitality, & felt that she was a genuine friend one to be trusted.

JANUARY

1899-01-01

SUNDAY

Eighteen inches of snow on the level, blowing a gale from the N.E. – bitterly cold.

We all remained at home.

Nelly & Milly Drake paid us a visit.

1899-01-02

MONDAY

The gale from the N.E. continues Intensely cold.

Jack & Nicholson went with the pony for Dewdneys sleigh at Irvings. Jack drove Miss Cowell to the Lowens to toboggan.

1899-01-03

TUESDAY

Intensely cold night, & morning with a keen wind – later calm & bright to Carry to town in the sleigh, & afterwards drove Kit to inquire for Mrs Roberts.

Jack drove Kit to the Lowens tobaggan.

Sir Henry Crease paid me a long visit.

Col Baker arrived from England per Charmer.

1899-01-04

WEDNESDAY

Sharp frost – very bright.

Drove with Frank to town in sleigh Arranged with Gillespie for a loan of \$5,000 @ 6% to repay Jno Trutch borrowed fr Deposit acct re purchase of 50- shares Capital Stock E.W.W. Co Col. Baker dined with us
Faithful Old Romer died.

1899-01-05

THURSDAY

Frost, dull overcast. Drove Kit to town – commenced to snow at noon, continued all the day. The Legislative Assembly

opened by Lieut Gov McInnes

1899-01-06

FRIDAY

Snowing slightly, mild.

Drove Carry to town & afterwards to Old Book, gave him \$5- & a bundle of old clothes.

Beginning to look like a thaw.

Frank dined in town

1899-01-07

SATURDAY

Bright sunshine after a light frost.

Frank & Miss Cowell went to [*left blank*] to skate drove them in sleigh to the Saanich station nearly upset opposite the Drakes gate.

Drove Kit to McCauley Point to see the toboggan party, afterwards to town. Snow fast disappearing, heavy sleighing. Jack went to Hatley Park Col. Baker dined with us.

1899-01-08

SUNDAY

Rained incessantly. Snow disappearing.

Remained in doors.

Frank in town.

Ridgeway Wilson, & Willy Ward called.

Revd Barber came to supper.

1899-01-09

MONDAY

Kit Seedy

S. West wind slight rain. Snow disappearing very fast, streets & side walks sloppy.

Remained in doors

Frank in town. Jack returned fr. Hatley

1899-01-10

TUESDAY

Lovely day mild & bright

Legislature sat all night to fight out the Infamous Prentice & Dean Election Bill.

Drove Kit to Esquimalt, took Miss Cowell home after a 14 days visit.

Road heavy, slush snow, & ice.
Frank dined with Col Baker.
Frank & Jack went to Public Meeting
to protest against Election Bill. The
meeting adjourned to Legislative assembly
to present petition against passage of Bill.
