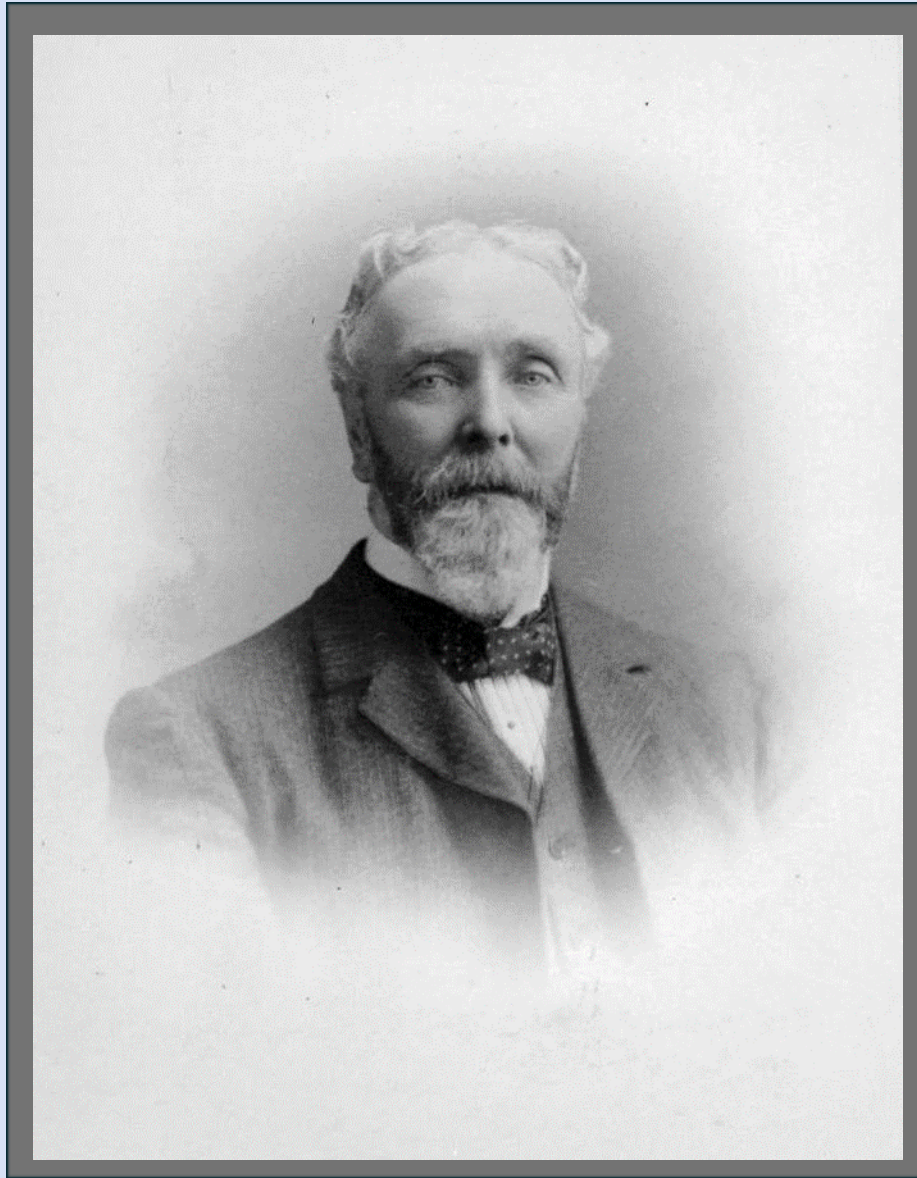

FOREWORD

Peter O'Reilly's 1904 diary has been voluntarily transcribed for informational purposes only. Researchers interested in this diary are advised to consult the original document housed at the Royal British Columbia Museum & Archives, found in MS-2894, the O'Reilly family fonds.

TRANSCRIPTION NOTES

Each year's transcription includes a brief diary summary for each month. A reference and comments section is also provided to identify people, places, events, or things mentioned in the diaries. Comments, where provided, are discretionary and are given when it appears helpful to the understanding of the diary contents. The existence of a reference or comment within the diary is indicated by an asterisk beside the diary date. Multiple asterisks indicate multiple references or comments for the same date.

Square brackets are used to denote transcriptionist comments. Best guesses of words or phrases appearing in the text are enclosed in square brackets and not italicized, while functional comments about the text are italicized. The following are examples of functional comments.

- [*illegible*] – a word cannot be read.
- [*deletion*] – a strikethrough cannot be read.
- [*no entry*] – no entry in the diary for that date.
- [*left blank*] – a space reserved for text entry.
- [*overwritten text*] – text written over the top of other text.
- [*loss*] – text that is too faint to read.
- [*missing*] – microfilmed diary does not contain that date.

Spelling inconsistency is commonly found and is usually not corrected from the original, however, letters are occasionally inserted in square brackets to clarify the understanding of an otherwise misspelled word.

Deleted words and sentences are included and struck through where legible.

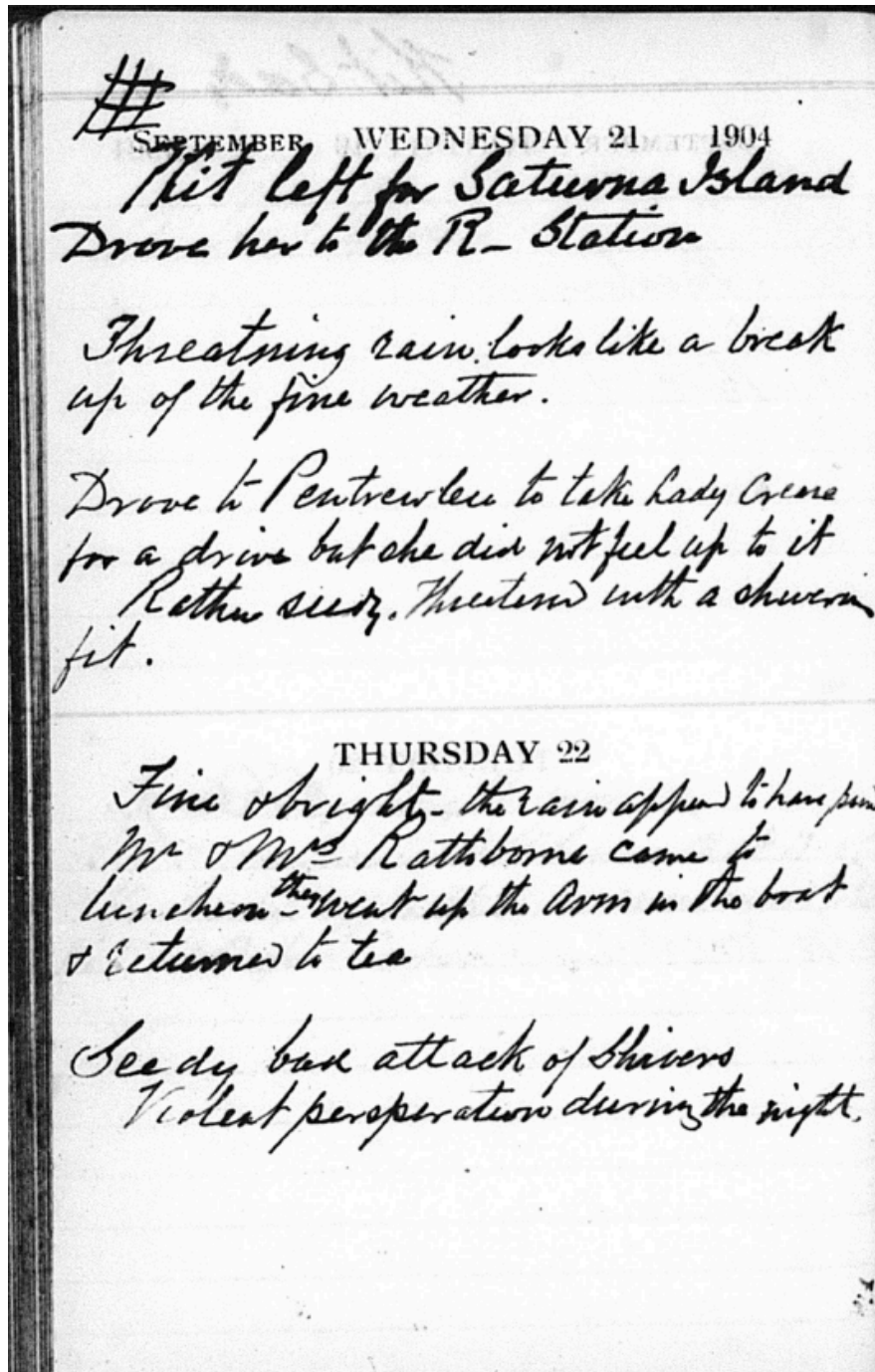

DIARY SUMMARY

JANUARY

Peter O'Reilly begins the year with heavy cold – Steamer *Clallam* sinks in a storm near Victoria, 56 passengers and crew are lost – Frank O'Reilly surveys a laneway at Fairfield, returns to his work in the West Kootenay area – wedding of Harry Pooley and Laura Loewen.

FEBRUARY

Albion Iron Works shows a “heavy loss” – Clement Cornwall recuperates at Point Ellice after leaving hospital – Peter comes down with another cold – Victoria Gas Co shows another “discouraging” report and reduces dividends.

MARCH

“Another dear old friend gone”, the death of Peter's brother-in-law Joseph Trutch in England at age 78 – Peter and Kathleen “Kit” O'Reilly visit the new Point Ellice bridge replacing the previous bridge which partially collapsed in 1896 – Jack O'Reilly goes hunting on Discovery Island – Louisa D Ellis, sister of Thomas Ellis, arrives for a visit.

APRIL

Louisa D Ellis leaves for Penticton - Kathleen “Kit” and Jack go golfing - Peter is troubled by his leg injured in an 1885 carriage accident, frequently rests in bed – Harold Twigg and Harold Payne are frequently at tea and dinner.

MAY

Meetings continue regarding the poor financial state of Albion Iron Works, receiver appointed on behalf of the bond holders of Albion - regatta and fireworks on the Gorge for Victoria Day - Jack salvages wood from old Point Ellice bridge - drawing room repainted – Peter visits Major George Dyne and Mrs Sarah Pearse.

JUNE

Pleasure trips up the Gorge on the boat “Puffer” – Major Dyne treated for appendicitis – death of Fanny Dodgson after an extended illness and hospitalization.

JULY

Jacks suffers from lumbago – Harold Twigg passes his law exam - Dr Jones operates on Frank's finger “without the use of Ether” - Peter has another shivering attack – death of lawyer Hugh Aikman, “Another good old timer gone”.

AUGUST

Esquimalt Water Works dividend declared, operational report not encouraging - a fire at Albion Iron Works causes serious damage, Peter and Kathleen view the destruction – frequent visits with Sarah Pearse - Reverend Barber decides to leave St Saviour's Church for health reasons despite Peter's advice to stay - Jack wins the croquet tournament in Vancouver for the third time.

SEPTEMBER

Peter's leg “troublesome” – Labour Day parade in Victoria - Peter experiences a “Seedy bad attack of Shivers Violent perspiration during the night.” - Kit and Peter attend the agricultural exhibition in Saanich and watch horse races.

OCTOBER

Jack goes hunting on Moresby and Prevost Islands, often bringing back grouse, pheasants, brant, quail, and snipe for friends – Kathleen and Polly Payne play golf at Macaulay Point - Kathleen and Peter attend consecration of the St Paul's or “Esquimalt” Church moved to its new location - Peter experiences another “Bad attack of shivers, in bed most of the day”.

NOVEMBER

Jack goes hunting and Kit plays golf - mangolds harvested from the field and stored for the winter – Robert Jackson has a “slight stroke of Paralysis”.

DECEMBER

Peter pays last doctor bills for Fanny Dodgson - Kathleen gives away old clothes, writes Christmas cards – Point Ellice holly distributed to friends – Peter notes his wedding anniversary (1863) and the death of his wife Caroline (1899) – Kathleen plays golf and Jack goes hunting - three of Peter's teeth are removed.

REFERENCES & COMMENTS

1904-01-09

Steamer *Clallum*

The Steamer *Clallum* sank during a storm in the Strait of Juan de Fuca on its way to Victoria after departing Port Townsend, Washington on what "should have been an ordinary voyage." Fifty-six people died. The *Clallum* had been in operation for only six months.

1904-01-21

James Edward Clifford Goodrich

(1851-1925)

Royal Navy Commodore, Second Class (1903), Commander-in-Chief, Pacific Station (1903-05) following Lewis Bickford, appointed Knight Commander (1908).

1904-09-18

Charles Edward Cooper

(1852-1916)

Anglican minister, came to Vancouver Island in 1893 serving at various parishes, then at St Saviour's Church, Victoria West (1904-11) following Rev. William Barber.

1904-10-30

comment

St Peter and St Paul Anglican Church was moved in 1904 from its waterside location next to the Esquimalt Royal Navy Dockyard to avoid damaging reverberation from naval gunnery practice.

Heavy nights rain, fine day Municipal Election Frank busy preparing for his departure for Kootenay Kit went to tea with Mrs Walker Brian paid me a visit. Twigg came to tea & dinner. My cold much better. Grace came to show Josephine Photo.

1904-01-15

FRIDAY

H. Barnard elected Mayor over Redfern by 700. majority Frank had decided not to leave till tomorrow My cold better, moved into the writing room for the first time. Kit called at Hospital to inquire for Cornwall. Dr Jones called, also Musgrave Kit dined with Mrs Croft Frank & Jack put my papers in order.

1904-01-16

SATURDAY

Very fine. My Cold better. In writing room. Frank busy packing. Kit, Jack Cory Powell & Twigg played golf. Revd Barber Called Cory Powell came to tea. Frank in town. Frank left for Kootenay at 11.30 P.M.

1904-01-17

SUNDAY

Rained during the night & at intervals during the day. Cold N.W. wind Kit & Jack went to St Saviours at 11. OC My cold decidedly better, spent the day in the writing room. Drake paid me a long visit. Mara called Kit called to the Hospital. Fanny Dodgson supposed to be dying. Revd Barber & Twigg came to Supper.

J.W.T. Born 18th Jany 1826. Died 2nd March 1904.

Snow on ground ½ inch deep, the first of the Season very wintery J.W.Ts 78 Birthday Clare, & Eileen lunched with Kit My cold better. Looks wintry

1904-01-19

TUESDAY

Sharp frost cold E. Wind Zephy Crease paid me a visit Kit went to see Mrs Pearce. Dispatched papers to Hathorn & Nicholson.

1904-01-20

WEDNESDAY

About an inch of snow on the ground. Snowing & Sleetng. Rain during the afternoon Nonie Powell came to tea My cold much better Jack dined in town, dinner to Harry Pooley.

1904-01-21 *

THURSDAY

Fine & mild, thawing Kit went to town After lunch she called on the Commodore & Mrs Goodrich - out Jack drove to town he inquired for Mrs Pearce.

1904-01-22

FRIDAY

Mild threatening rain.
Charley Stahlschmidt came out, he assessed the damage by fire in Jacks room at \$10- which he paid
Jack went with Burton to shoot geese at [left blank] Island.

1904-01-23

SATURDAY

Rained a good deal during the forenoon
Fine evening.
Mable S. Walkem & B [left blank] Langley Married. Kit went to the Home.
Thomson Musgrave & Dr Helmcken called - all deaf.

1904-01-24

SUNDAY

Slight frost - A lovely day, bright & mild
Kit went to St Saviours at 11. O.C.
My cold very much better
Went to early dinner in dining room for the first time
Maud & Nelly paid me a visit.
Also the Pinder girls, Dr & Mrs Fagan & Mara. Twigg & Revd Barber at Supper
Jack returned fr his shoot poor sport.

Heavy rain & hail during the
night & Most of the day
Remained in doors.
Jack & Kit went to the Theatre with
Burton & wife.

1904-02-20

SATURDAY

Shower of Sleet & snow all day
up at 7 AM.
Miss Payne left for Saturna Isl.
Jack drove her to the station.
Got a return of my cold, seedy.
Cornwall went to Vernons, he returned
to tea. Musgrave & his daughter
also came to tea. - Henry Cornwall & bride
dined with us.

1904-02-21

SUNDAY

Rain & high wind through the
night & till about noon. Cornwall &
I intended to go to Church but could
not venture. Kit & Jack went to
St Saviours at 11- O.C. Revd Barber officiated

Kit & Jack walked to town to call on Beaumont & wife at the Balmoral Maud & Carry came to tea. Kit & Twigg went to St Saviours at 7- O.C. Revd Barber & Twigg at Supper

1904-02-22

MONDAY

Pouring with rain Strong S.W. Wind. Very seedy all day. Carry Barclay called to say good bye to her father & to me, as she proposes to leave for home on Friday. Kit went to town & paid some visits. - Bad shivering fit obliged to go to bed early.

1904-02-23

TUESDAY

Rain at intervals throughout the day Remained in bed till noon My cold very heavy Mrs Beaumont came to lunch Cornwall went to town at 11- OC. Kit went to the Hospital to see Fanny found her very low. Afterwards went to tea at the Powells, she had talks with Mr & Mrs Beavan Jack dined in town with Woolly.

1904-02-24

WEDNESDAY

Bright mild day. Remained in bed till noon - feeling better. Cornwall in town twice. Mrs Gillespie paid us a visit. Dr Jones called.

1904-02-25

THURSDAY

Kit Seedy Cold East wind. Miss Payne paid an early visit Attended ½ yearly meeting of the Gas Co. - a very discouraging report. Div declared 2.% for ½ yr. Viz O'R - \$235 - C.A.H. 100 - J.W.T. 100 - J.T. 70

Carry & Maud came to lunch Beaumont & wife came to tea.

1904-02-26

FRIDAY

Kit Seedy Dark gloomy day. Rained from 8 AM till noon. Miss Payne arrived fr. town 10.30 & remained till 12.30. Mrs Pinder lunched A miserable day, Cornwall could not get out of doors. - The Admiral came to tea & remained to dinner. - After dinner Miss Payne & Mr Bradley Dyne called & stayed a couple of hours.

1904-02-27

SATURDAY

Very Cold bright glymps of sunshine - heavy showers of sleet & rain Cornwall went to town Miss Payne came early she remained to luncheon, Sheard drove her to the train Sidney, at 45-3 OC Shears drove Kit to the Hospital Fanny much better.

1904-02-28

SUNDAY

Rained very heavily during the night, & forenoon. Had intended to go to Church, too wet. Mara, Pooley, Bridgeman, & Temple called. Bridgeman promised to obtain Mrs Pinders signature to the receipt for the policies of insurance paid by me Twigg came to tea & Supper.

1904-02-29

MONDAY

Heavy falls of snow during the day. Very cold - feels again like winter. Twigg came to luncheon Jack returned from his shoot at Discovery Isl. he brought back 7 Brant. Maud Cornwall arrived to pay us a visit. She & Kit walked to call on Mrs E. C. Baker.

MARCH

1904-03-01

TUESDAY

Three inches of snow & snowing heavily till 9. AM. - afterwards bright sunshine.

Kit & Maude went to town, they had tea with Mrs Jackson, & called on Mrs Vernon

Jack drove to Oak bay. The pony very lame in hind leg.

1904-03-02

WEDNESDAY

Frost, bright & mild.

Kit & Maud went to town

Grace & Marjorie came to luncheon wonderfully got up. Full of their intended departure to England on Saturday. They were uncertain whether they would remain in London or go to Brussels. Beauchamp has plenty of money though he never talks about it &c &c Cornwall walked to town, he is very much better. My cold very heavy Jack dined in town.

1904-03-03

THURSDAY

Dull all day very like rain

Pony still lame

Kit & Maude went to town

Kit called on Mrs Pearce.

Revd Barber called & remained to tea. Clare paid us a visit

Jack remained in town for dinner

1904-03-04

FRIDAY

Rained heavily during the night & forenoon.

Crow Baker called to talk over the extension of Linden Avenue from Belcher to Richardson St. J.W.Ts proportion not to exceed \$430- Telegram from England to say that J.W.T. died on the 2nd inst. Another dear old friend gone. Born 18th Jan'y 1826 - aged 78. yrs 1½ months. Julian lunched, Puss went

to see Annie Pinder. - Maud went with Mrs Croft to the theatre & supper.

1904-03-05

SATURDAY

Incessant heavy rain, night & day.

My cold very heavy.

Gamble called to express his sorrow for J.W.T. Beauchamp Pinder & afterwards Mrs Pinder called to say good bye. The former told me that he had guaranteed repayment of each for the Pinder family to England. Showed him my acct for cash advanced to Mrs Pinder & the girls, he said he would consider it a debt due by himself. The girls came after dinner to say good bye.

1904-03-06

SUNDAY

Another wet day - rained during the night.

Kit Jack & Maud went to St Saviours at 11- OC.

After dinner Maude went to the Fosters to tea. Mara called.

Twigg came to tea & Supper

Kit Jack went to St Saviours at 7 OC

1904-03-07

MONDAY

Heavy rain all day.

My cold very heavy, remained in bed.

Kit had the furniture removed from her room - She slept in dressing room Maude left to pay a weeks visit at Govt House.

1904-03-08

TUESDAY

Rain & sleet

In bed all day. Cold no better

Drake paid me a visit, long chat

Kit made some calls.

1904-03-09

WEDNESDAY

Fine but cold bracing day.

In bed. Cold very troublesome

Clem paid me visit

Beaumont called, afterwards he dined, he said his wife had gone to the Jubilee Hospital the day before. The Bishop Miss Perrin & Nonie Powell called.

1904-03-10

THURSDAY

Very stormy during the day & all night.
Revd Barber paid me a visit
& remained to tea.
In bed my cold very heavy

1904-03-11

FRIDAY

Blowing a gale. The lowest
Barometer in many years
My cold still very heavy.
Kit in town
Cornwall went

1904-03-12

SATURDAY

Rained & Stormed

1904-03-13

SUNDAY

Rain & Sleet. H. Payne & his sister
came here after breakfast & sent to St
Saviours Ch with Kit & Jack at 11 OC. The
Bishop preached. - The Paynes at early dinner.
