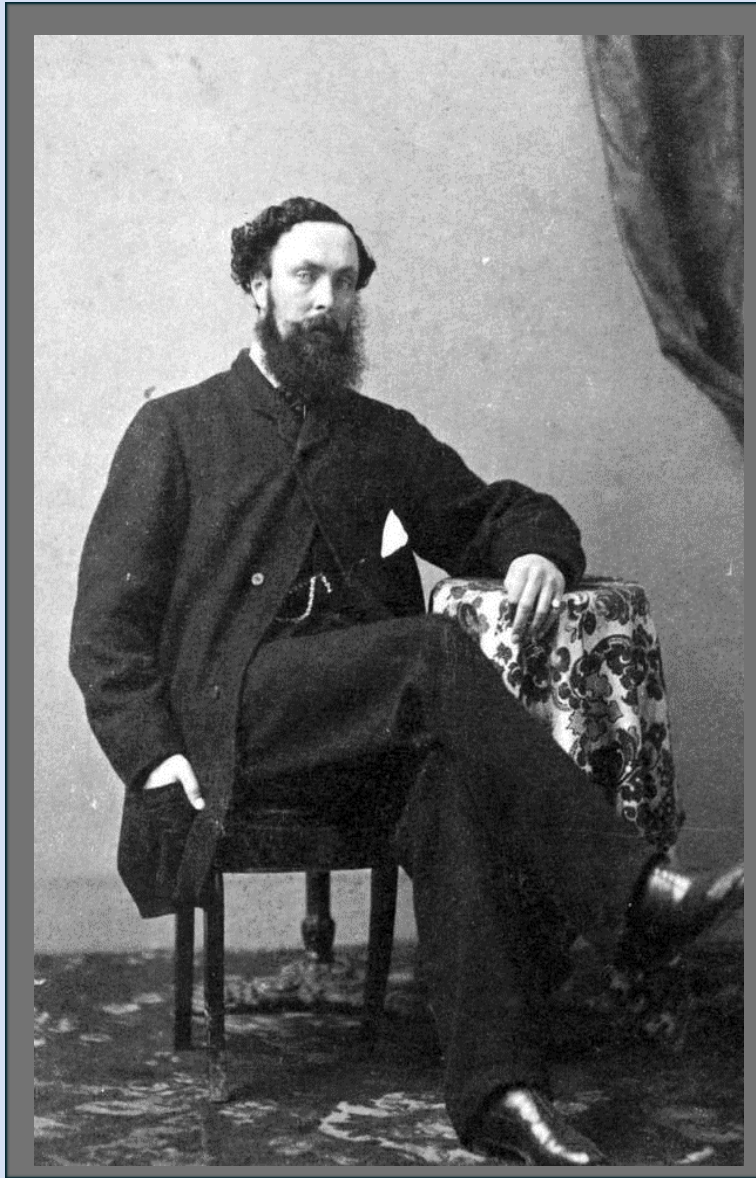

FOREWORD

Peter O'Reilly's 1873 diary has been voluntarily transcribed for informational purposes only. Researchers interested in this diary are advised to consult the original document housed at the Royal British Columbia Museum & Archives, found in MS-2894, the O'Reilly family fonds.

TRANSCRIPTION NOTES

Each year's transcription includes a brief diary summary for each month. A reference and comments section is also provided to identify people, places, events, or things mentioned in the diaries. Comments, where provided, are discretionary and are given when it appears helpful to the understanding of the diary contents. The existence of a reference or comment within the diary is indicated by an asterisk beside the diary date. Multiple asterisks indicate multiple references or comments for the same date.

Square brackets are used to denote transcriptionist comments. Best guesses of words or phrases appearing in the text are enclosed in square brackets and not italicized, while functional comments about the text are italicized. The following are examples of functional comments.

- [*illegible*] – a word cannot be read.
- [*deletion*] – a strikethrough cannot be read.
- [*no entry*] – no entry in the diary for that date.
- [*left blank*] – a space reserved for text entry.
- [*overwritten text*] – text written over the top of other text.
- [*loss*] – text that is too faint to read.
- [*missing*] – microfilmed diary does not contain that date.

Spelling inconsistency is commonly found and is usually not corrected from the original, however, letters are occasionally inserted in square brackets to clarify the understanding of an otherwise misspelled word.

Deleted words and sentences are included and struck through where legible.

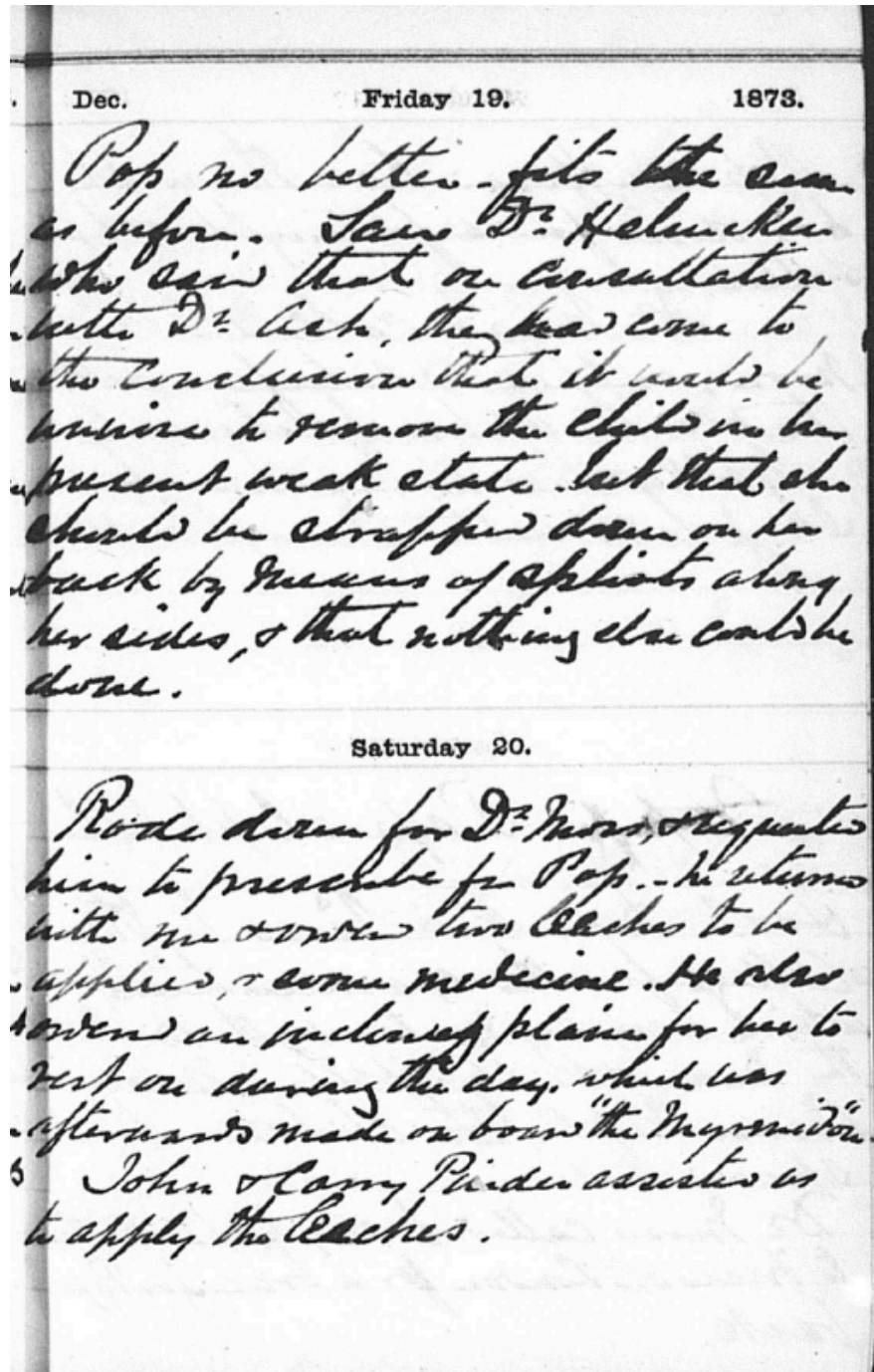

Dr Helmcken & Dr Ash determine the treatment for Mary O'Reilly's back condition.
December 19-20, 1873



DIARY SUMMARY

JANUARY

Drs Helmcken and Ash examine Mary O'Reilly regarding her back and determine "no particular treatment should be adopted" - Mary's illness continues - Mrs Mullett becomes nurse and house servant - Peter O'Reilly travels to New Westminster, then back to Victoria - niece Carry Pinder stays with the O'Reillys - Peter suffers from headaches and earaches.

FEBRUARY

Family members ice skate at Skinner's Pond - croquet ground is mowed, new grass seed sown - maple trees planted outside house gates - Peter hunts at Langford's Lake.

MARCH

Court business at New Westminster - Peter meets with Bishop Hills and attends church, "the singing excruciating" - at home in Victoria work commences on building cribbing and a fence around the property.

APRIL

Birth of Peter and Caroline's fourth child and second son, Arthur John O'Reilly, on February 4th - vegetables and roses planted, apple trees pruned - Peter has three teeth "stuffed" by dentist - leaves for Yale, Lytton and Kamloops to hold court.

MAY

Peter mediates dispute between John Haynes and Tom Ellis regarding grazing land boundaries - Peter spends time with Tom and Georgie Ellis at their Penticton ranch - death of Constable and Omineca Gold Commissioner William Fitzgerald.

JUNE

Frank has measles - another servant departs without warning, "in confusion all the day" - several picnics occur.

JULY

Two servants quit, a previous servant returns, another servant hired as children's maid - Peter attends shareholders meeting of Victoria Gas Company - Arthur John O'Reilly christened at St John's Church - Peter departs for Yale, Lytton, and Kamloops to hold court.

AUGUST

Peter and Caroline "Carry" attend picnics, a concert, and a ball - Peter, Joseph Trutch, and Captain Richard Hare travel to Nanaimo in Hare's ship HMS *Myrmidon* to fish and shoot.

SEPTEMBER

Naval review at Colwood - Peter & Caroline attend dinner aboard HMS *Repulse*, a ball at Government House, and hold dinners at home for friends - seven-year-old Frank starts attending school - Peter departs once again for Yale, Lytton, Kamloops.

OCTOBER

"Prairie chicken" hunting - horse races at Ashcroft - Peter sees the Tommy & Georgie Ellis and their baby daughter.

NOVEMBER

Court held at New Westminster, Lytton, Clinton, Lillooet, Kamloops, and Yale - Peter visits several acquaintances along the way and goes hunting.

DECEMBER

Winter conditions clog the Fraser River with ice - steamer *Enterprise* curtails service - Peter arranges with Indians for an "Express Canoe" to take him back to New Westminster - the family witnesses the continued suffering of Mary "Pop" from her back ailment - travel to New York or London is considered to seek advice - Drs Helmcken and Dr Ash discuss her treatment and recommend against moving Mary due to weakened condition - Mary is restrained to a board by splints and bled with leeches - Dr Moss investigates obtaining back brace - New Year's Eve dinner party canceled.

John Ash

(c. 1821-1886)

Physician, politician, member of colonial and provincial legislatures (1865-82).

1873-01-10

Victoria Gas Company

Starting in 1860 this company provided coal gas for Victoria's heat and light from the gold rush era to the twentieth century. Peter O'Reilly purchased shares in the company and became one of its directors.

1873-01-14

Jason Ovid Allard

(1848-1931)

Son of Ovid Allard, born at Fort Langley, worked for the Hudson's Bay Company, then the Canadian Pacific Railway in 1871, interpreter with knowledge of five Indian dialects.

1873-01-27

Caroline Acland "Carry" Pinder

(1853-1942)

First daughter of George & Emily (Trutch) Pinder, niece of Peter & Caroline (Trutch) O'Reilly. Married Richard Hare (1836-1903) in 1874 in Victoria.

1873-02-09

John Hamilton Gray

(1814-1889)

Lawyer, politician, Supreme Court judge in BC from 1872.

1873-04-04

Arthur John O'Reilly

(1873-1946)

Fourth child (second son) of Peter & Caroline O'Reilly born April 4, 1873, at Point Ellice House, Victoria.

1873-04-24

"Jin Win"

Nickname for Jane Shaw (Moir) Dewdney, wife of Edgar Dewdney.

1873-05-21

William James Roper

(1841-1916)

Rancher, agriculturalist, purchased Cherry Creek Ranch from Nicholas Hare in 1877.

1873-08-09

James Arnold Raymur

(1823-1882)

Ship captain in West Indies trade and Hong Kong to London tea trade, manager of Hastings Mill at Burrard Inlet, home in Victoria.

1873-08-13

Richard Hare

(1836-1903)

Commander of the HMS *Myrmidon* which became stationed at Esquimalt in 1873, married Caroline Acland Pinder (Peter & Caroline O'Reilly's niece) in 1874 in Victoria.

1873-08-13

HMS *Myrmidon*

Cormorant-class gun vessel of the Royal Navy launched in 1867 and sold in 1889.

1873-08-21

Joseph Beauchamp Matthews

(?-1892)

Doctor, British Columbia Garrison Artillery surgeon, resident of Victoria (1867-92).

1873-09-19

Brian Halsey Tyrwhitt-Drake

(1866-1949)

First son of Montague & Joanna Tyrwhitt-Drake, neighbors to the O'Reilly family.

1873-09-25

Elizabeth (Ormonde) Gray

(c. 1828-1895)

Wife of Supreme Court of BC judge John Hamilton Gray (1814-1889). She married him in 1845.

1873-09-25

Collegiate School for Boys

Frank O'Reilly attended this school for boys started by Bishop George Hills in 1860.

1873-12-20

Edward Lawton Moss

(1843-1880)

Royal Navy doctor and surgeon in charge of the Naval Hospital at Esquimalt (1872-75), member of the British Arctic Expedition (1875-76).

DIARY – 1873

JANUARY

1873-01-01

WEDNESDAY

The most stormy day of the season, blowing a gale from the N.W. accompanied with slight occasional showers.

A number of people called to pay their New Years visits Remained at home all day. Frank laid up with cold & cough.

1873-01-02 *

THURSDAY

Fine day. Remained at home. Dr Helmcken called to see Pop - arranged with him to invite Dr Ash to meet him here tomorrow in consultation. Bulkley called - also Capt & Mrs Delacombe. Arranged with Bulkley to go to shoot with him on Saturday next.

1873-01-03

FRIDAY

Fine day. Went to town at 2-P.M. had a chat with Ward Called on Sir Jas Douglas, & saw Lady D. & Mrs Work Doctor Helmcken & Doctor Ash called by appointment to examine Pops back, they are of opinion that she has met with an accident of some kind, but that no particular treatment should be adopted, & recommended good care & plenty of exercise.

1873-01-04

SATURDAY

Very blustry day, with occasional showers. Drove Carry & the children to town, to enquire from Mrs Ash about the girl Hawkins, then drove all to Govt house to ask as there was no place to put the Carriage into. I returned to town & left the trap at Dunlops, raining

heavily, sent a covered Carriage for Carry & the children & drove home alone

1873-01-05

SUNDAY

Carry laid up with a bad cold. Took Frank to Church at St Johns. Revd Gribbell officiated, very small congregation Carry cold so bad that she was obliged to go to bed.

1873-01-06

MONDAY

Lovely day. Carry & Pop very ill, in bed all the day.

1873-01-07

TUESDAY

Fine day. Carry & the little one no better both remained in bed. Revd Jenns, Ward, Bulkley & J.W.T. called. Mrs Dewdney came about 11- AM & took Puss & Frank for a walk.

1873-01-08

WEDNESDAY

The little one, "Pop" very ill throughout the night, & all day Carry slightly better. Mrs Dewdney again came & took the children for a walk John called for a few moments at 6. O.C.

1873-01-09

THURSDAY

Fine day. Zoe & Mrs Dewdney lunched. Thomson called. Mrs Mullett came to take Lena's place as nurse & house servant. Carry very ill, bad cold.

1873-01-10 *

FRIDAY

Lovely day. Attended meeting of Directors of the Gass Company at the Works, at 10 AM present Drake, Grancini, Chairman, Finlaison & myself. Thomson Sec.

Paid into Bank \$363-77- Viz Pay for Decr \$250- cheque fr Edmonds \$95-77- & cheque fr Watt \$180. Drew \$200 to pay Bills.

Recd letter fr Tom & Georgia

1873-01-11

SATURDAY

Went to town early - paid a number of bills. Sent Helmcken to see Pop, & Carry who is still very ailing Called at Govt house to see Joe about the C. C. at Westminster. Took a short walk with Mrs T. Mother & spent the day at Rock Bay

1873-01-12

SUNDAY

Cold raw ~~rain~~ showery day. Very seedy - remained at house. Ball & Sullivan, Ward & Bulkley called. Wrote to Fitzgerald in answer to his letter of Nov & enclosed him Hibbens, & Higgins bills.

1873-01-13

MONDAY

Rained heavily all the day packed the Port wine in store cupboard. Connell called [*deletion*] staid to dinner, walked into town with him & he returned to tea.

1873-01-14 *

TUESDAY

Cold stormy day. Paid into the bank to the acct of T. E. \$133- Viz Dust \$103- & \$30- bal of \$80- after repaying myself \$50- fr P O order for Armstrong. Got Jason Allards money transferred fr old savings Bank to the Dominion - Paid some bills made enquiries as to the chances of getting down fr Burrard Inlet. Note to T. E. finished my letter

1873-01-15

WEDNESDAY

Left at 7.30 Am in Enterprise for to hold

C. Court at New Westminster.
Good passage - arrived at 3¼
P.M. spent the evening at the
Claudets, slept in Bushbys room
Wrote to Carry.

1873-01-16
THURSDAY

Up at 8 breakfasted at
Mrs Moreys.
Held County Court at
11- - finished at 3- P.M.
Very seedy one of my
very bad head aches.
Wrote to Allard & sent him
Jasons Pass book.
Posted letters to T. E. & Georgia, & 4 from
home - also to Allard with Pass Book

1873-01-17
FRIDAY

Left on one of Lewis' horses for
Burrard Inlet at 8- AM, arrived at
10- Michaud took me across in his
wee canoe, was kindly received by
Moody & Chambers, but to me intense
disgust learned that the Grappler
would not sail till tomorrow.
Went all over the mill with Chambers
& spent the evening at his house in
Company with Capt Deverill

1873-01-18
SATURDAY

Up at 7- & and when about to
go on board learned that the ship
"Seaforth" was not ready to go to sea
& would not start till tomorrow
poured with rain.
Spent a lonely miserable day
varied by a slight row between
Capt Porter of the Seaforth & Moody
Spent the evening at Chambers
house had some music

1873-01-19
SUNDAY

Slept on board the Str Fly -
got off at 9¾ after a good deal
of delay. - Raining heavily
slight fair wind, but the Seaforth
being a ship of 1100 tons register &

being laden with 100,000 feet of lumber
we made but slow progress. The
rain cleared off about noon & continued
fine all day, got safely across the
gulf about 9- P.M.

MONDAY

Hazy morning

1873-01-21
TUESDAY
[no entry]

1873-01-22
WEDNESDAY
[no entry]

1873-01-23
THURSDAY
[no entry]

1873-01-24
FRIDAY
Wet day. In town all
day with Ball.

1873-01-25
SATURDAY
Rained heavily all the day
In town at 11- AM Interviewed
Nelson & Dewdney with Ball - in
reference to our positions as C. C. J's
Dewdney & his wife dined

1873-01-26
SUNDAY
Beautiful day. Church at
11- O.C. St Johns - Revd Jenns
officiated. Hold Communion.
Took a stroll with the children
Mrs & Mrs Trotter Johnston
called.

1873-01-27 *
MONDAY
Beautiful clear day - slight frost
during the night. Drove Carry Pinder
from Govt house to Rock Bay to stay &
walk with us. The Members of Parliament
left for Ottawa - Viz Dewdney, Thompson
& Nelson - accompanied by Houghton,

Ball for Frisco. Mrs Dewdney came to stay with us. Ah Hoey - Chinaman went on two days leave to spend his New Year. =

1873-01-28

TUESDAY

Rained incessantly all the day. Very seedy having taken medicine for my head ache & ear which of late has been very troublesome.

1873-01-29

WEDNESDAY

Fine morning, pruned the Ribies in front of house. Rained heavily all the afternoon.

1873-01-30

THURSDAY

Intensely cold day - commenced to rain about noon, & continued all the evening, when it cleared up the wind went round to the north & a hard frost set in.

1873-01-31

FRIDAY

The coldest day of the we have had since Nov. - everything frozen.

Remained in doors all the day my head & ear no better.

Mrs Dewdney & Carry Pinder walked into town

FEBRUARY

1873-02-01

SATURDAY

Very hard frost, Carry Pinder Mrs Dewdney & Frank went to Skinners pond to see the skaters, where they found a crowd enjoying themselves. Joe & John called, & spent half an hour with us. Dr Helmcken also called - spoke to him about my ear & head. -

1873-02-02

SUNDAY

Lovely day - bright clear & frosty. All went to Church but myself & Pop. - My ear very sore & painful. Carry had treated us to some music. Mrs Dewdney & Miss Pinder went to St Johns to evening service Freezing hard all the day.

1873-02-03

MONDAY

Commenced to thaw, wind went round to the south. Carry went again to Skinners pond, but the ice was soft & slushy. Connell & Charles came to tea.

1873-02-04

TUESDAY

Beautiful soft balmy sunshine day Connell came to see me about his gun, & remained for dinner. While at dinner Zoe & Willie came, & then Mrs Delacombe & her children - so although the carriage was at the door we could not go for a drive & neither of us had been out of the house for over a week. John came fr Zoe at 6- P.M.

1873-02-05

WEDNESDAY

Rained incessantly all day. John came at 5- & remained till 6- .

1873-02-06

THURSDAY

Bulkley breakfasted, very wet morning, went with him to shoot at Langfords Lake - cleared up at noon had a very fair sport. Killed 3 brace of grouse & Bulkley ½ - got back at 6- PM.

1873-02-07

FRIDAY

Fine day drove to Govt house with Carry & Carry Pinder - where it was arranged that the latter

was to go to the Finlaysons party
Took Mrs Dewdney & Carry Pinder
to the Finlaysons had a very
pleasant party - a good dance
& capital supper.
Ah Hoey, the Chinaman, left
as he was unable to work from sickness

1873-02-08
SATURDAY

Very tired & suffering from a bad
headache. Drove to Mrs Stahlschmidts
to enquire as to the character of a
Chinaman "Fun" - who had lived with
her for 5 yrs, recd a good account
of him. Willie joined us & drove with
us to town.

1873-02-09 *
SUNDAY

Franks ninth birthday.
Drove to Govt house for Mrs Trutch
Senr who spent the day with us.
We all went to St Johns at
11- The Bishop preached - Revd Jenns
read the service.
Judge Gray, & Charles & wife
called.
Drove Mrs Trutch back to Govt house
also Carry Pinder who has been with
us nearly a fortnight.

1873-02-10
MONDAY

Walked into town & took Frank
Ordered some feed fr. Leveneue - a
case of whisky fr. Finlay - & some
groceries fr H.B.C. Left Frank with
Zoe & went with John to hear the
debate of the amendment of the
Constitution, "the creation of a
fifth Portfolio."

1873-02-11
TUESDAY

Lovely day drove Carry & Mrs Dewdney
to town, called on Mrs Crease, Mrs
Cridge, Mrs Bulkley, Mrs Jenns,
& St Johns, home at 6- P.M.

1873-02-12
WEDNESDAY

Rained heavily during the night,
& till about noon, borrowed the
mowing machine fr. Mr Jenns &
cut the grass on the Croquet ground.
Drove Carry & Mrs Dewdney to
Govt house. - Fine bright night.

1873-02-13
THURSDAY

Lovely day. Thomson & Bulkley breakfasted
& then went with them fr a days shooting
near Langfords Lake - only got 4 brace
between us, on our return to the stable
we found that Rodger had broken his
rope & had gone away, so there was
nothing for but to tramp it, reached
house at ¼ 9- P.M. very much used
up.

1873-02-14
FRIDAY

Borrowed Thomsons horse & went back
to Langfords Lake to look for Rodger found
him with difficulty cought him in
Porters corrall, found the blankets, but
not the collar or harness or traces,
got back at 2 PM drenched through
Joe Julia Mrs Trutch sen & Carry
lounched with us
Rained heavily all the day

1873-02-15
SATURDAY

Snowed the greater part of the
day. Read letters fr Fitzgerald
Bushby, & one fr Kilroy of Lytton
with \$400- enclosed for T. Ellis.
Bulkley & McCreight paid us
a visit, planted the maple
trees outside the gates.
Dr Helmcken called to see
Pop.

1873-02-16
SUNDAY

Slight fall of snow. Mrs Dewdney &
Frank went to morning Church -
Begbie paid us a long visit.
Walked with Carry to St Johns at
7- P.M. Revd Jenns officiated.

1873-02-17

MONDAY

Walked to town with Frank then on to Govt house with Joe, when he informed me of his having recd a letter fr Sir John McDonald - in reference to the C. C. J's - Paid \$400 into the B. B. C. to acct of T. E. (recd fr Kilroy). Paid a number of Bills.

1873-02-18

TUESDAY

John & Bulkley went to shoot. Sowed the Blue Kentucky grass seed in [deletion] Croquet ground. Drove Carry & Mrs Dewdney to call on Mrs Fellows, The Finlaysons & to do a few commissions in town. Sent Lewis to Jackson office for the Pointer pup on his return the pup got loose & we had a difficult job to catch him. Packed my traps in readiness for a start to N. W. in the morning.

1873-02-19

WEDNESDAY

Left for New Westminster in Enterprise at 7.30 AM - smooth pleasant passage arrived at 3.¾ P.M. about 3 inches of snow. - Spence one of the passengers. Dined at Mrs Morey's. - Spent a couple of hours at Claudets - found them busy packing, preparing to leave for England at beginning of next month

1873-02-20

THURSDAY

Held County Court at New Westminster. Cold raw day remained in quarters & wrote some letters. Seymour called & spent a hour with me.

1873-02-21

FRIDAY

Recd telegram at ¼ 9- OC from Chambers to say the Grapler was at Burrard Inlet. Started at 9- in stage Wm Fisher & myself being the only passengers. Arrived at Moody

mill at 11½, dined & left for Victoria at 3- P.M. having Moodys scow in tow anchored at Plumper pass at 10 O.C. & remained for the night beautiful day, calm & mild Posted letters to Fitzgerald & Tommy [overwritten text] Posted letters to Kilroy with his note to T. E. for \$400-

1873-02-22

SATURDAY

Got under way at 6. AM spent a couple of hours hunting about for the missing buoy fr mouth of Fraser River, but could not find it, returned through Canoe pass & reached Victoria at 1. P.M. found all well. Lovely day. =

1873-02-23

SUNDAY

Took medicine, & felt ill all the day, did not go to Church. The finest day of the season, bright sunshine calm & warm. John & Zoe came at 7- PM & stayed to tea.

1873-02-24

MONDAY

Blew a gale from the N.W. which lasted all the day. Worked in the garden. Bulkley called to arrange with me for a days shooting on Thursday. Walked to Govt house

1873-02-25

TUESDAY

Lovely day, worked in the garden The wind changed to the N.W. about noon, when it became very cold. Joe & Ward called, the former invited us to take share of his box at the Theatre

1873-02-26

WEDNESDAY

Bitterly cold day - blowing a

gale from the N.W. with every
Joe & W appearance of a
snow storm.

1873-02-27
THURSDAY

3 inches of snow on the
ground - very cold morning
snow remained all day
Enterprise arrived fr N. W. at 3.30.
Recd letters fr. B. Griffin & Evans
with \$60- Rent fr. Charley at Yale
also letters fr Buie Boyd & Pope.
Mail Str Prince Alfred arrived
Recd a letter from White.

1873-02-28
FRIDAY

Snow still on the ground but
Disappearing. Fine bright day.
Got Rodger shod.
Thomson called.

MARCH

1873-03-01
SATURDAY

Worked all the day
gardening. Carry & Arthur
Pinder called on horseback.
Joe paid us a short visit in
the evening.

1873-03-02
SUNDAY

Seedy - took some medicine
& remained in doors very stormy
no one went to Church & read the
morning service.
Willy called in the evening
& did not behave well when
asked to walk with Mrs Dewdney
to Church

1873-03-03
MONDAY

Very stormy morning - cleared
up about noon. Drove Carry
& Mrs Dewdney to call at Govt
house. Met Mrs Trutch Sen on our
return & arranged to drive her

to Rock Bay tomorrow if fine.
Wrote to White.

1873-03-04
TUESDAY

Rained incessantly all the day
Wrote a number of letters.

1873-03-05
WEDNESDAY

Drove Mrs Trutch Sen, & Carry Pinder
to Rock Bay to spend the day. John
& Zoe came about 4 O.C. & remained
for tea - drove to Govt house to leave with
Mrs Trutch, & did not get back till
12¼ - put up the horse & carriage
& did not finish till 1- O.C. AM

1873-03-06
THURSDAY

Blustery day. Gardening =
Enterprise returned fr. N. W
Recd letters from Georgie, & Tommy
Also one fr. Vowell, Buie, Boyd.

1873-03-07
FRIDAY

Up at 6- A.M. worked in garden
till breakfast. Arranged with Warner
to put in Cribbing & build the fence
round the lots at \$2.50 per day.
Went to town to see Jones &
Courtney in re his (Jones) claim of \$2.25
Called at L & W office about N.
Hares, & A Coulties title deeds
& Got permission fr A B Grey to
Cut some logs on Yales land on the
arm.

1873-03-08
SATURDAY

Warner commenced to work at
the cribbing in front of the house.
John came out & promised to survey
the lots.
Joe Julia & Carry Pinder called on
horseback.

1873-03-09
SUNDAY

Fine morning drove Carry to St
Johns & put up the pony carriage at

Dunlops. Called at Zoe's.
Commenced to rain at 1½ PM,
& continued at intervals through
the evening. Begbie called

1873-03-10

MONDAY

Raining all night - commenced
to snow at 8-½- & by 10- there
was 3 inches deep on the ground,
beastly day throughout

Warner mended some articles
of furniture, but knocked off
at noon.

Mail Steamer Prince Alfred
arrived - Ball & Barnard returned
in her. - Recd a letter from
Graves.

1873-03-11

TUESDAY

Rained heavily all morning.

Had notice inserted in Colonist. Sale of
T. E's cattle, 16 head cows & heifers 100- Steers

Drew my allowance for holding
C. Court at N. W. 16- days & 80-00
Joe called & paid us a long visit

1873-03-12

WEDNESDAY
