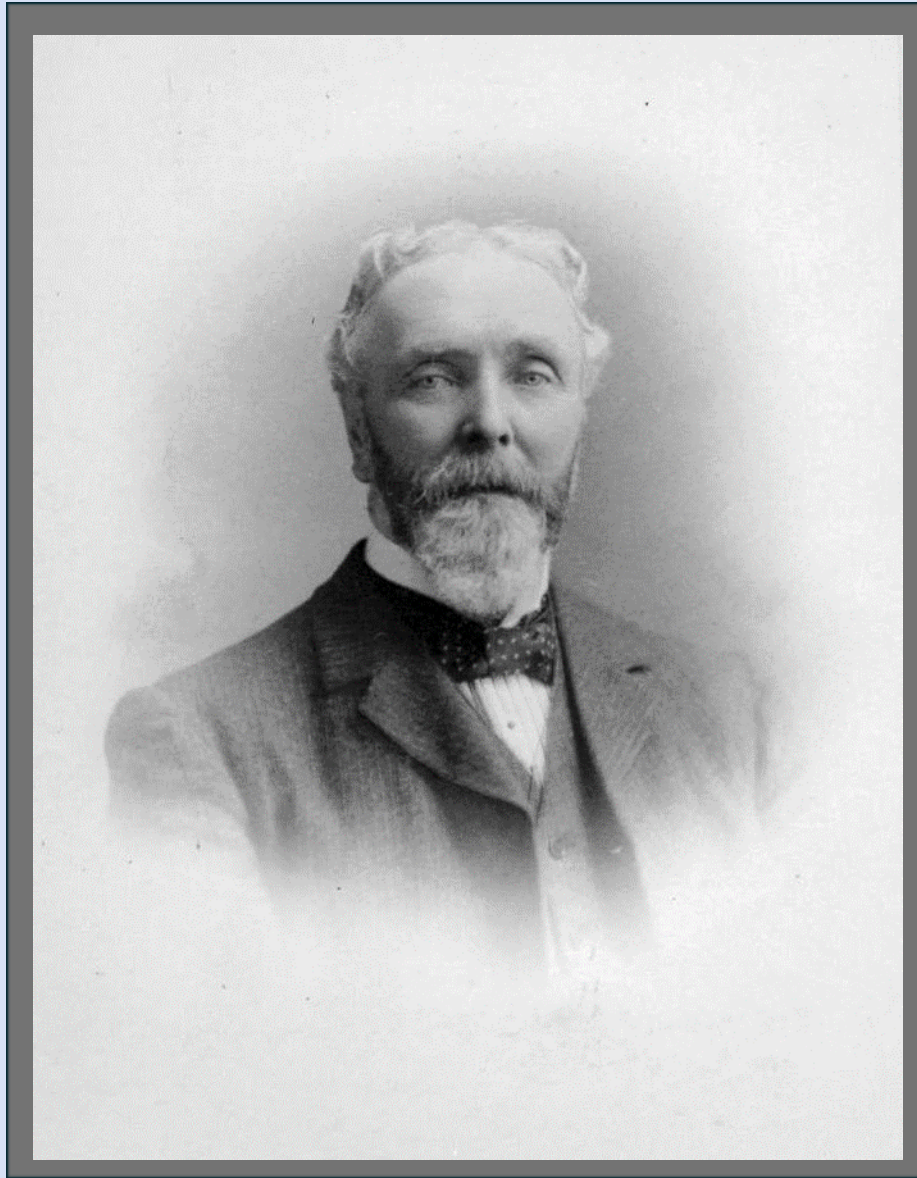

FOREWORD

Peter O'Reilly's 1905 diary has been voluntarily transcribed for informational purposes only. Researchers interested in this diary are advised to consult the original document housed at the Royal British Columbia Museum & Archives, found in MS-2894, the O'Reilly family fonds.

TRANSCRIPTION NOTES

Each year's transcription includes a brief diary summary for each month. A reference and comments section is also provided to identify people, places, events, or things mentioned in the diaries. Comments, where provided, are discretionary and are given when it appears helpful to the understanding of the diary contents. The existence of a reference or comment within the diary is indicated by an asterisk beside the diary date. Multiple asterisks indicate multiple references or comments for the same date.

Square brackets are used to denote transcriptionist comments. Best guesses of words or phrases appearing in the text are enclosed in square brackets and not italicized, while functional comments about the text are italicized. The following are examples of functional comments.

- [*illegible*] – a word cannot be read.
- [*deletion*] – a strikethrough cannot be read.
- [*no entry*] – no entry in the diary for that date.
- [*left blank*] – a space reserved for text entry.
- [*overwritten text*] – text written over the top of other text.
- [*loss*] – text that is too faint to read.
- [*missing*] – microfilmed diary does not contain that date.

Spelling inconsistency is commonly found and is usually not corrected from the original, however, letters are occasionally inserted in square brackets to clarify the understanding of an otherwise misspelled word.

Deleted words and sentences are included and struck through where legible.

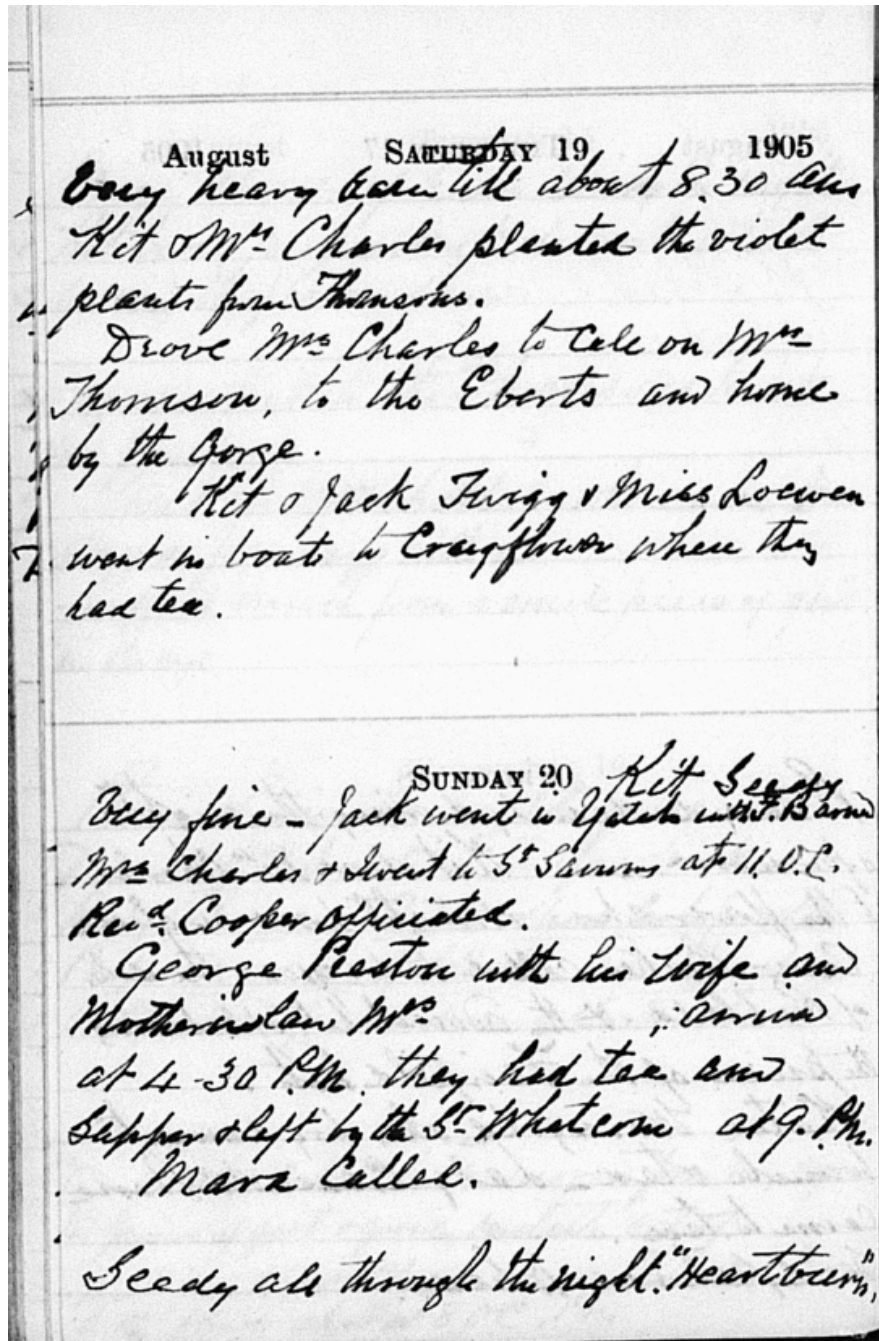

DIARY SUMMARY

JANUARY

Peter O'Reilly begins the year again with a cold, continues to attend director's meetings of Albion Iron Works – the usual visitors call at Point Ellice throughout the month – first outing on January 24th with a visit to Mrs Sarah Pearse.

FEBRUARY

Kathleen "Kit" O'Reilly and friends go ice skating at Colwood and Langford Lake – business of Albion Iron Works "unsatisfactory" – meeting of Christ Church Cathedral trustees – "My cold very heavy, remained in bed" – Sir Henry Crease, whom Peter had known since 1860, passes away at age 82.

MARCH

Peter's front teeth replaced - vegetable gardens and flower beds prepared for spring planting, early cabbage planted – Point Ellice property surveyed for the purpose of bringing in a new water line from Goldstream – Captain Herbert Lewis, whom Peter had known since 1859, passes away at age 77.

APRIL

Peter, Kit, and Jack O'Reilly work in the garden, employees plant potatoes in the field – Christ Church trustees meeting – Herbert Dodgson quits employment with Albion Iron Works.

MAY

Jeanie Dewdney, wife of Edgar Dewdney, in poor health - Frank and Kathleen O'Reilly call on Mrs Dewdney in concern for her well-being - family and friends go to the Gorge to enjoy Victoria Day festivities and fireworks.

JUNE

The family continues to attend church at St Saviour's (Victoria West) and at St Paul's (Esquimalt) – employee Thomas Varley quits and goes to England - death of James Allan Grahame, long-time HBC employee - Esquimalt Water Works to purchase 4000 additional acres to add to Goldstream watershed – first payments go out to beneficiaries of Joseph Trutch's estate following his 1904 death.

JULY

July weather "roasting hot" - Peter attends meetings of Albion Iron Works and the Victoria Gas Company – friends and family play croquet - Jack returns to Vancouver to play in a croquet tournament - Peter sells his Gas Works stock for \$9400 and receives \$4000 from the Joseph Trutch estate - Kit works in her garden.

AUGUST

Christ Church trustees meeting - money deposited in the bank as a legacy for Kathleen O'Reilly - shingling of the house commences – visits with Mrs Pearse and Mrs Charles – August 20th - "Seedy all through the night, "Heartburn" – last diary entry written on August 21st.

Peter O'Reilly died from heart failure on September 3, 1905, at age 78.

Funeral of Peter O'Reilly

Victoria Daily Colonist newspaper article regarding the funeral and life of Peter O'Reilly who passed away on September 3, 1905.

Funeral Today of Hon. O'Reilly

Remains of Eminent Pioneer to
Be Laid in Their Last Rest-
ing Place.

A Large Attendance Yesterday
at Funeral of the Late
Michael Baker.

The funeral of the late Hon. Peter O'Reilly has been arranged to take place this morning at 9.30 from the residence, Pleasant street, Point Ellice, and at St. Saviour's church, Victoria West, at 10 o'clock.

Owing to the late hour at which news of his death reached the Colonist on Sunday evening it was impossible to publish more than a very inadequate reference to the passing of so distinguished a pioneer. On his arrival in Victoria in the spring of 1859 Sir James Douglas recognized in the newcomer the man he wanted to preserve law and order in the remoter districts, and appointed him stipendiary magistrate with headquarters at Fort Langley, on the Fraser. In 1861-1862 he was gold commissioner and stipendiary magistrate in Cariboo, and two years later became commissioner for McCullough creek, in the Big Bend country, on the Columbia. Next year Mr. O'Reilly was selected as stipendiary magistrate and gold commissioner for Wild Horse creek, in East Kootenay. At that time an attempt was made by the government to collect a royalty on the gold, and Mr. O'Reilly had charge of the gold escort which came out over the Hudson's Bay trail to Hope. There were nine pack horses bearing the precious metal. The attempt to collect the royalty, however, was futile, and ultimately it was abandoned.

Goes to Omineca

In 1871 Mr. O'Reilly was appointed stipendiary magistrate and gold commissioner for the Omineca, and it was while associated with this district that he made a memorable trip to the coast, in which he nearly lost his life. It was in the autumn of '71 this journey was undertaken. He left his post on October 28th, and unfortunately the winter had set in early, and the obstacles were great, but he and his party succeeded in reaching Hazelton on November 26th. After proceeding down the Skeena some distance they crossed over to the Naas. This was a particularly arduous trip, because the snow in some places was thirty feet deep, but they were careful to constantly keep in sight of their fires. One man had his hands frozen off. While on the journey they were joined by a party under Gus. Wright, an old-timer well known throughout the province. In the meantime great anxiety prevailed here with regard to the party, who were believed to be lost. A man-of-war vessel was despatched to Port Simpson to assist in the search. She remained there a fortnight, and then giving it up the ship sailed. The next day, however, Mr. O'Reilly and party turned up at Simpson.

Member of Legislative Council

In 1863 Mr. O'Reilly was appointed a member of the legislative council of the colony of British Columbia, and strongly supported Confederation. Four years later he came to Victoria, where he established his residence. He became Indian reserve commissioner, an appointment he received from Sir John A. Macdonald, his duties bearing upon the Indian lands. He was retired eight years ago. Since then he has taken no active part in public affairs, although he has always manifested the deepest interest in anything which affected the welfare of the city and province. He was interested in a number of commercial ventures, being a director in the Albion Iron Works, the B. C. Corporation, the Gas Works and other enterprises.

Held in High Esteem

Mr. O'Reilly was highly respected all over the province. No matter where one may go he will always encounter some old settler who will express the warmest regard for a gentleman who was unquestionably an able administrator. As stipendiary magistrate in Cariboo he preserved order with a firm hand, and won the respect of all classes. He knew the province like a book, in fact few men, indeed, were more conversant with near and remote districts than he. He was a man of splendid physique, and fond of outdoor life. He was a great lover of horses, and was one of the best judges of these sagacious animals in the West. But it was the happy combination of admirable qualities that won the esteem of people of all degrees. A man of sterling integrity, upright and generous, he leaves a host of friends distributed all over the world who will deeply deplore his death.
