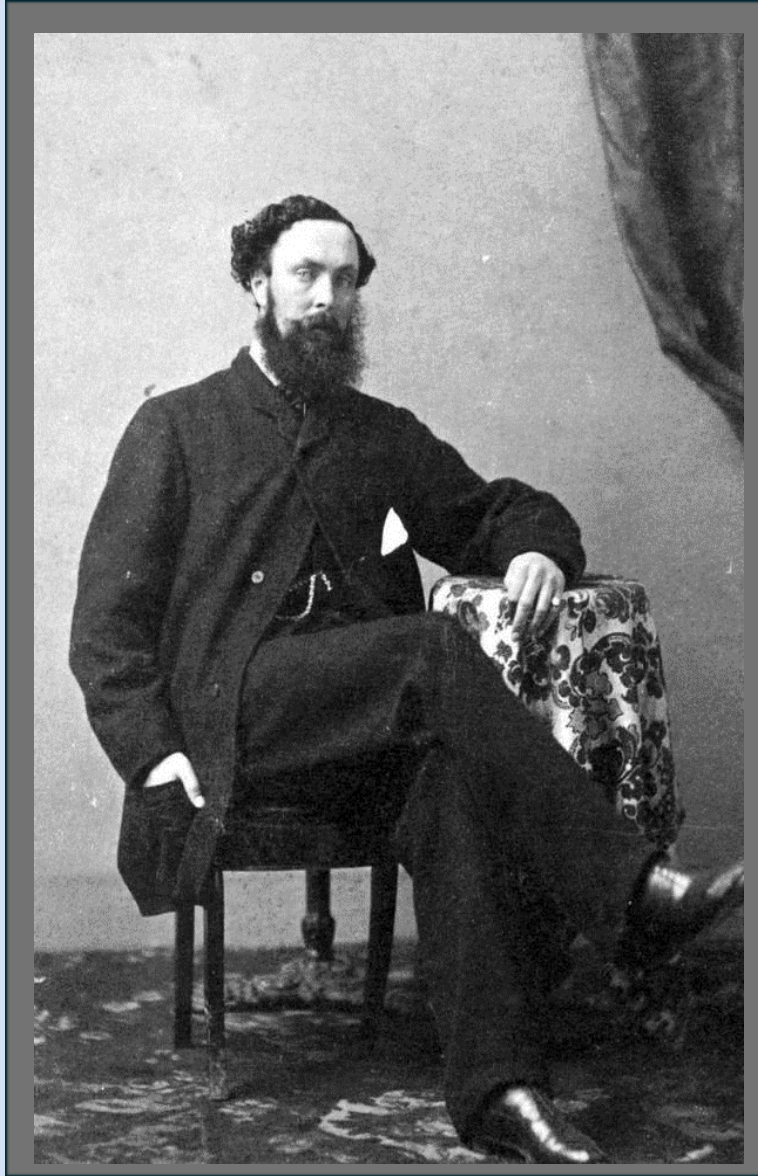

## FOREWORD

Peter O'Reilly's 1874 diary has been voluntarily transcribed for informational purposes only. Researchers interested in this diary are advised to consult the original document housed at the Royal British Columbia Museum & Archives, found in MS-2894, the O'Reilly family fonds.

## TRANSCRIPTION NOTES

Each year's transcription includes a brief diary summary for each month. A reference and comments section is also provided to identify people, places, events, or things mentioned in the diaries. Comments, where provided, are discretionary and are given when it appears helpful to the understanding of the diary contents. The existence of a reference or comment within the diary is indicated by an asterisk beside the diary date. Multiple asterisks indicate multiple references or comments for the same date.

Square brackets are used to denote transcriptionist comments. Best guesses of words or phrases appearing in the text are enclosed in square brackets and not italicized, while functional comments about the text are italicized. The following are examples of functional comments.

- [*illegible*] – a word cannot be read.
- [*deletion*] – a strikethrough cannot be read.
- [*no entry*] – no entry in the diary for that date.
- [*left blank*] – a space reserved for text entry.
- [*overwritten text*] – text written over the top of other text.
- [*loss*] – text that is too faint to read.
- [*missing*] – microfilmed diary does not contain that date.

Spelling inconsistency is commonly found and is usually not corrected from the original, however, letters are occasionally inserted in square brackets to clarify the understanding of an otherwise misspelled word.

Deleted words and sentences are included and struck through where legible.

## SAMPLE DIARY PAGE

Peter O'Reilly counts ballots at Yale for Member of Parliament. Edgar Dewdney is reelected.  
February 24, 1874

February	TUESDAY 24	1874
<p>The Ballot boxes arrived at 6. Am &amp; In presence of Morehouse &amp; Halliday commenced to count the votes at 7 1/2 which resulted in a majority for Dewdney of 66. He having polled 75. - Chisholm 9. - &amp; 9. disallowed. - making in all 93. - No returns as yet fr. Wild Horse Perry Rock Creek. - &amp; Kereunan. Started in Canoe with Dewdney. - &amp; portage between Yale &amp; Hope. - - Jernam at Jones for the night.</p>		
WEDNESDAY 25		
<p>Up at 1. Am. - started at 2 1/2. nearly got capsized by running aground a snag. - overlook Express Canoe at Millars, reached N. W. at 5 1/2. fine day but cold. - Recd No 3. Spent an hour with the Bushby's.</p>		

## DIARY SUMMARY

Mary O'Reilly continues to suffer from back pain – Caroline "Carry" O'Reilly is exhausted from Mary's care, requires bed rest - Peter O'Reilly organizes the Yale district election.

### FEBRUARY

Peter delivers ballots and ballot boxes to Yale - counts votes and determines Edgar Dewdney re-elected MP for Yale.

### MARCH

Peter returns to Victoria and resumes domestic activities, works in garden – Mary is fitted with back brace to relieve pain.

### APRIL

Peter collects additional election ballots at Yale – travel to Boston Bar in buggy made difficult by four to ten feet of snow – court held in Kamloops, Lillooet, Clinton, Lytton, and Yale.

### MAY

Illness of 74-year-old Carry's mother Charlotte Trutch, two doctors treat her with brandy and champagne, her health improves within a week - Peter attends Victoria Gas Company director's meeting - trains a young horse.

### JUNE

Horse training continues - boathouse constructed at Point Ellice - Peter returns to Yale, Lytton, Kamloops, Clinton, Lillooet to hold court – Peter listens to group of 300 Indians with Dr Israel Powell asking for "more land".

### JULY

Wedding of Captain Richard Hare and Carry Pinder (O'Reilly niece) at Christ Church Cathedral, thirty-six people attend the wedding breakfast - picnic on the "Arm" (Gorge ateway) - ball at Government House.

### AUGUST

Peter temporarily replaces Magistrate Elliott in Victoria – departs for court circuit and places his horse "Archie" on board the steamer – goes bird hunting with dog "Gypsy" who lacks a hunting instinct – delays return to Victoria to take care of friend Edward Sanders who has typhoid fever.

### SEPTEMBER

The Bishop's Court trial of Dean Edward Cridge of Christ Church Cathedral for repudiating authority of Bishop Hills lasts five days - Peter participates in the trial in an advisory role as "assessor" – another court circuit proceeds with a stop in Ashcroft to see the Cornwalls and go hunting.

### OCTOBER

Court in Kamloops, Lytton, and Yale – Peter visits friends in Hope before returning to Victoria – hires Indian boy "Dock" at \$5.00 per month plus clothing - two tons of carrots, straw, and hay delivered - Supreme Court trial of Dean Cridge held, Judge Begbie grants injunction against Cridge.

### NOVEMBER

Cridge conducts services in association with the Reformed Episcopal Church – clothing and boots ordered from Ireland – Fraser River steamer service stops due to ice – Peter hires Indians to take him upriver, continuous rain hampers trip to Hope – Yale road impassable, no further travel until conditions improve.

### DECEMBER

O'Reilly and Trutch families celebrate Christmas at Government House - New Year's Eve spent with Trutches, Hares, and Dewdneys at the O'Reilly home.

**1874-01-01**

**THURSDAY**

Heavy fall of snow at 8. O.C. after which clear bright cold day. Carry very unwell, obliged to remain in bed - the children also ill - Visitors could not be received. Did not leave the house except to Zoes in the evening to say we could not dine with them

**1874-01-02**

**FRIDAY**

Slight fall of snow. Pop not quite so well during the night, Joe & Capt Hare called, afterwards Mr Vernon

**1874-01-03**

**SATURDAY**

Pop suffered a great deal of pain during the night. Carry completely used up from over work & she remained in bed all day. Carry & Willie Pinder walked over the former remained the night. Rained heavily. ~~At home all the day~~ obliged to go to town - paid a few bills.

**1874-01-04**

**SUNDAY**

Poor Pop had another bad night - dear Carry no better. Did not leave the house

**1874-01-05**

**MONDAY**

Rained heavily during the night & forenoon. Pop passed a better night, Carry very weak, & low. Joe & Julia called & took Carrie Pinder away that she might go to a dance at the Crease's. Could not attend Synod meeting

as I intended to have done.

Very wet night Pop suffered a good deal of pain Carry no better - Called in Dr Helmcken who happened to be attending at the Drakes. John & Carry Pinder went to a little dance at Dr Helmckens

Rained heavily during the night. Carry still very poorly & obliged to keep her bed. John & Carry Pinder arrived about 4- the latter remained

Drove into town to arrange about carrying out Election in Yale district. Telegraphed to R Pope to say Return of Writ cannot be made before May, 12th March being the day named in the Writ.

**1874-01-27****TUESDAY**

Wet morning. Walked into town, went to Govt offices & got a supply of forms for carrying on the Elections, saw Walkem for a few minutes.

Capt Hare paid us a visit of importance.

Vernon came out & asserted to prepare the Proclamations all of which I dispatched under cover to Teague

**1874-01-28****WEDNESDAY**

Slight rain throughout the day. -

Walked to town - had an interview with McCreight & Robertson in re the position of the C. C. Js.  
Paid some bills.

The party from Govt house paid us a visit. Afterwards Capt Hare called.

**1874-02-04**  
**WEDNESDAY**  
Rained heavily through the night. Left Victoria in Enterprise at 8- A.M. en route to Yale to hold an Election for the Commons of Canada Blowing hard for a couple of hours - after which it became calm. Dewdney & wife Barnard & Johnston on board. Arrived at N. W. at 4½. - Spent the evening with Bushby. - Wrote No 1-

**1874-02-05**  
**THURSDAY**  
Heavy rain - owing to reports of the quantity of ice in river Mrs Dewdney returned to Victoria in the Enterprise at 8- - Started for Yale at 9- in a downpour of rain Barnard Dewdney & self in our

can[o]je. - Arrived at the Mission at 8½. P.M. drenched through.

**1874-02-06**  
**FRIDAY**  
Hazy morning - got off at 8- some heavy showers of rain & snow at Cheam made a portage of 1½ mile, & put up in an Indian house Alexie Chief, spent a miserable night.

**1874-02-07**  
**SATURDAY**  
Started at 7½. Fine day. Stopped at Jones' & had breakfast - reached Hope at 4½. - engaged a bed at Gallagher's. Dined with Dewdney at Mrs Glennie's, paid Landvoigt a short visit & turned in at 9- AM

**1874-02-08**  
**SUNDAY**  
Left Hope at 5- A.M. made 8- portages ice very rotten - rained heavily all day - reached Yale at 11-. Put up at H. B. House where I was kindly recd by Harvey From 4 to 5- ft of snow on the ground.

**1874-02-09**  
**MONDAY**  
Slight fall of snow which lasted the greater part of the day. Held nomination Dewdney proposed by Barnard who made a good speech. Chisholm was proposed by McQuarrie - show of hands for Dewdney. = Busy all day preparing Election papers Ballot boxes &c - all of which were sent to Express office by 12- night

**1874-02-10**  
**TUESDAY**  
Fine day up country Dewdney & Barnard started on foot en route to canvass the Electors. Johnston started for Kootenay

as Election messenger.

Sent off No 2-

Fine day. - Recd copies of telegrams fr. Barnard [*deletion*] reporting the breaking up of the DeCosmos meeting at Victoria.

Took a small walk down town & then down the river road to the Cemetery

Fine day.

Remained in house working out the Election act & preparing the necessary forms &c.

Spent the evening at the The Harveys went to a party at Oppenheimers

Barnard returned, ill being unable to proceed on Dewdney's canvass.

He recd telegrams fr. Victoria to say that Walkem had been called on to form a Ministry in the room of DeCosmos

Hard frost during the night

Snowing all day.

Spent another dreary miserable day.

**1874-02-15**

**SUNDAY**

Breakfast - read, & commenced No 3-. Mail & Express

arrived at 1½ P.M. - Read -

No 1- also letters from Pope

Henry Cornwall & Vowell

also files of newspapers

containing accounts of the stir-

-ing times in Victoria.

**1874-02-16**

**MONDAY**

Up mail, left at 7- AM - packed by Indians to Boston Bar at 10. cts per lb. -

**1874-02-17**

**TUESDAY**

Barnard left with mail & express for N. W. in tending to remain at Hope to vote in the morning.

Busy in office preparing forms &s for Election tomorrow.

**1874-02-18**

**WEDNESDAY**

Opened booth for Election at 9- A.M., Ballot act, - very little Excitement. C. Morehouse, & Halliday in attendance as agents for the candidates. Closed poll at 5 P.M. only 13 votes polled.

**1874-02-19**

**THURSDAY**

Walked to the 4 mile post on Waggon road with Black - to see off the men at work shoveling snow off the road, which is in some places over 10 ft deep. - Rained nearly the whole way there & back.

**1874-02-20**

**FRIDAY**

Fine bright day - took a short walk. Spent a couple of hours in the evening at McMickings

**1874-02-21 \***

**SATURDAY**

Very fine day, but sloppy & unpleasant underfoot.

Recd a telegram fr. Barnard to say DeCosmos & Roscoe were elected for Victoria City

**1874-02-22**

**SUNDAY**

Cold stormy day - several showers of snow.

Mail in charge of Bristol arrived at 3. P.M. - Recd No

2- & files of newspapers.  
Dewdney arrived fr. the Upr Country.  
Recd telegram fr. McGhie to say  
the Ballot boxed fr. Coldstream &  
the Mission had arrived at Cache Cr.  
Directed them to be forwarded at  
once. Messenger to travel - night & day.

Dewdney, called & took early

rain throughout the day. Walked  
to town. The House of Assembly  
was prorogued at 3- P.M. was  
not present.

Fine day - remained at  
home.

Paid Hogan \$40- in  
full of all wages due him, and  
discharged him.  
Dined with Begbie

**WEDNESDAY**

Fine day. Walked into town  
John returned with me &  
remained to lounch.

Capt Hare & Joe called

**1874-03-05**

**THURSDAY**

Cold stormy day.

Capt Hare, & Carry Pinder walked over & remained to lounch.

Enterprise returned from Westminster, & walked to town with Carry, & got a budget of letters in the post office.

**1874-03-06**

**FRIDAY**

Cold & very stormy day - snow & sleet. - Walked to town - met Joe & had a long chat with him in reference to my Summons work. Lounched with him at Govt house

**1874-03-07**

**SATURDAY**

In town to see McCreight in reference to memorial to Dominion Govt C C Js.

Called on McDonald, & Roscoe on the same business.

Mara dined with us.

Mrs Robertson & Mrs Jenns called also Mrs & Mr McKay.

**1874-03-08**

**SUNDAY**

Stormy day. Carry, the Children & Self went to St Johns - the Bishop officiated & preached a Capital Sermon. Mrs & Me Dewdney dined with us.

**1874-03-09**

**MONDAY**

In town The Prince Alfred arrived with Mail. Mrs Graham returned in her.

In town again in reference to our C. C. Judge business.

The dinner to the Opposition took place at the Philharmonic hall.

**1874-03-10**

**TUESDAY**

The Dewdneys called - went to town with them & lounched with them. Drove to Esquimalt & back with Hamley. Joe called.

Dewdney & Roscoe called - drove again to Esquimalt to see them, & all other members off. - The Great DeCosmos arrived on board preceded by a band & a crowd who drank his health in Champaigne.

Wrote to Sanders, & sent him papers.

Fine day - worked in the garden. - Walked in the evening to call on Mrs Thomson.

Lovely day, remained at home worked in garden & had the drain finished at the north north of the house.

**THURSDAY**

Walked to town with Frank sent him home with his Granny who drove over to spend the day. Called on Mrs Charles Mrs Graham, & Zoe. Home at 2½ OC Capt Hare & Carry called, the latter spent the evening. Joe called while I was in town. Mrs McDonald called John came over for an hour, walked with him over the place, & he promised to see the Croque[t] ground sodded on Saturday

**1874-04-03**

Good **FRIDAY**

Left Victoria per Enterprise at 10 A.M. en route to Yale &c. Pearse on board to inspect the Sister Rock - fine calm day - arrived

at 5 P.M. Called on the Bushbys, & went with them to Church at 7 O.C. Revd Mason preached a capital sermon. St Onward arrived fr Yale - having damaged the casing of her cylinder. Recd letters from Haynes & T. E.
