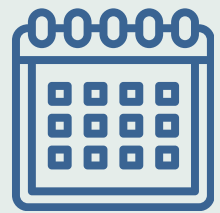


MY EXPERIENCE ON A CLIMATE DISTRESS RESEARCH PROJECT

I worked in a team publishing a daily survey aiming to look into how climate change effects peoples emotions and behaviour.

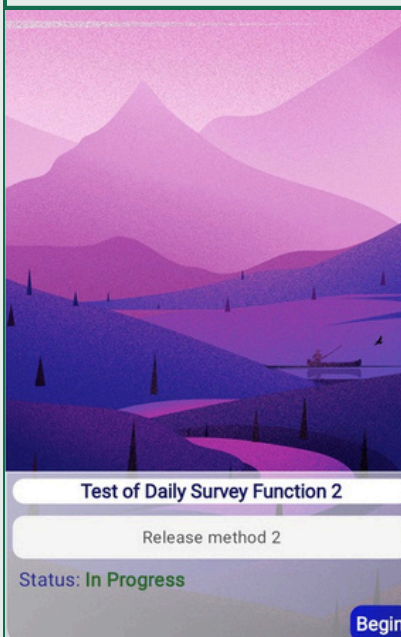


WEEKLY MEETINGS

My role in these meetings often included observing and listening, as well as talking about what I, and the others, were working on.



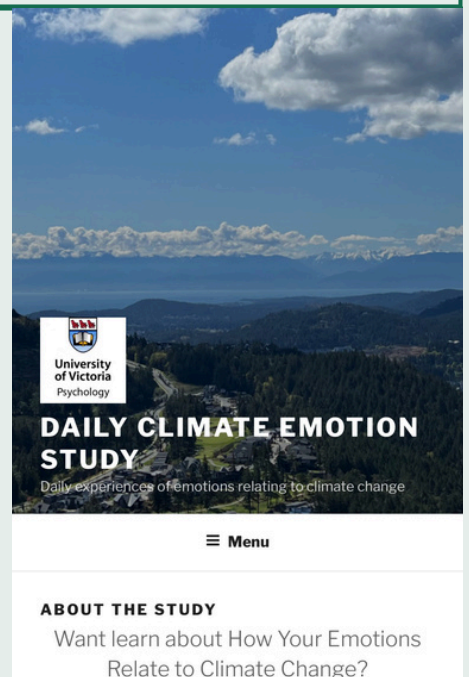
SURVEY TRIAL RUNS
