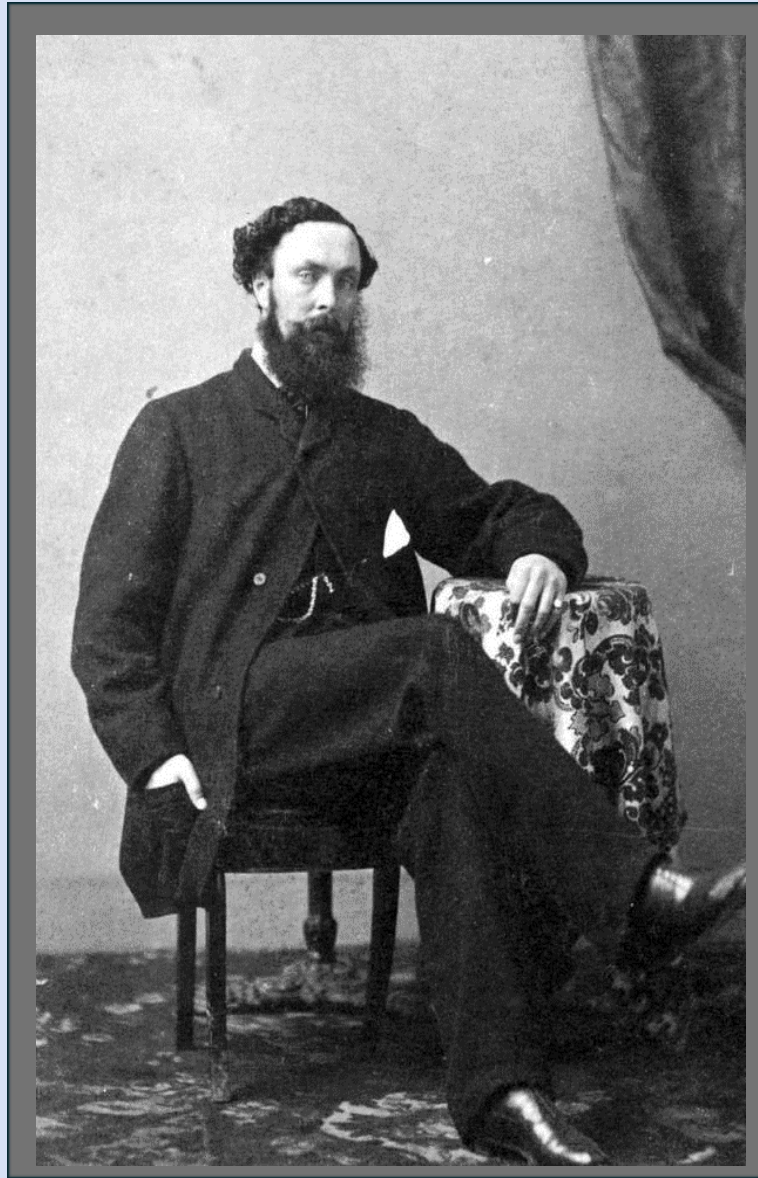

## FOREWORD

Peter O'Reilly's 1880 diary has been voluntarily transcribed for informational purposes only. Researchers interested in this diary are advised to consult the original document housed at the Royal British Columbia Museum & Archives, found in MS-2894, the O'Reilly family fonds.

## TRANSCRIPTION NOTES

Each year's transcription includes a brief diary summary for each month. A reference and comments section is also provided to identify people, places, events, or things mentioned in the diaries. Comments, where provided, are discretionary and are given when it appears helpful to the understanding of the diary contents. The existence of a reference or comment within the diary is indicated by an asterisk beside the diary date. Multiple asterisks indicate multiple references or comments for the same date.

Square brackets are used to denote transcriptionist comments. Best guesses of words or phrases appearing in the text are enclosed in square brackets and not italicized, while functional comments about the text are italicized. The following are examples of functional comments.

- [*illegible*] – a word cannot be read.
- [*deletion*] – a strikethrough cannot be read.
- [*no entry*] – no entry in the diary for that date.
- [*left blank*] – a space reserved for text entry.
- [*overwritten text*] – text written over the top of other text.
- [*loss*] – text that is too faint to read.
- [*missing*] – microfilmed diary does not contain that date.

Spelling inconsistency is commonly found and is usually not corrected from the original, however, letters are occasionally inserted in square brackets to clarify the understanding of an otherwise misspelled word.

Deleted words and sentences are included and struck through where legible.

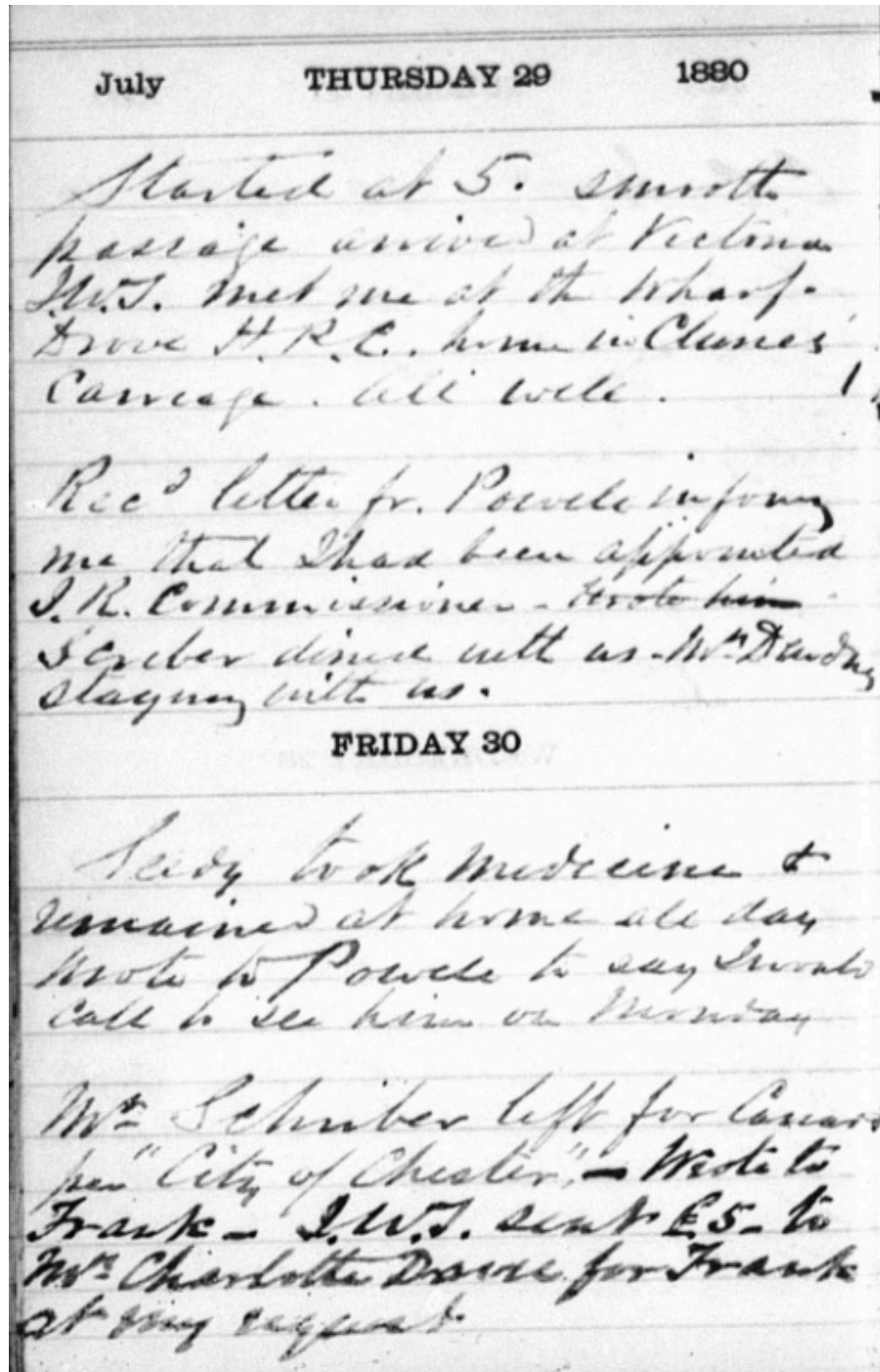

July 29, 1880



## DIARY SUMMARY

### JANUARY

Birthday party and decorated tree for Kathleen "Puss" O'Reilly – 3½ feet of snow on ground, travel by sleigh – Peter O'Reilly and others receive Gas Co and Loan Investment Society dividends – court at New Westminster – improvements to bathroom – wine ordered through Captain Hare.

### FEBRUARY

Peter attends annual shareholders meeting of B C Milling & Mining Co – views coffer dam construction for the Esquimalt Graving Dock – at Point Ellice measurements taken for fence and gates, and fir trees planted – court at New Westminster.

### MARCH

Victoria harbour freezes over – two court sessions at New Westminster - Peter attends murder trial of McLean brothers and Alex Hare – gate and fence construction at Point Ellice begins.

### APRIL

Peter is a pall bearer at the funeral of Mrs David Leneveu – Joseph & Julia Trutch return to Victoria after being absent since late 1876 – carriage hired to regularly take O'Reilly children to school – visit to HMS *Triumph* at Esquimalt harbour – court at New Westminster.

### MAY

Court at Yale, Lytton, Ashcroft, Kamloops, and New Westminster – Queen's birthday regatta on the Gorge in Victoria.

### JUNE

Bishop Silitoe for New Westminster diocese arrives from England – Jack O'Reilly takes his first trip with his father who holds court at New Westminster – second McLean brothers trial "declared null" – death of Mrs William "Doctor" Tolmie.

### JULY

Interest received from Loan Investment Society – court at Yale, Ashcroft, Kamloops, and New Westminster – Peter O'Reilly is appointed Indian Reserve Commissioner – Henry Cornwall from Ashcroft begins his extended stay at Point Ellice.

### AUGUST

BC Superintendent of Indian Affairs Israel Wood Powell, Premier Walkem, and Peter O'Reilly agree that Peter will not accept the position of Indian Reserve Commissioner until he is relieved of his judicial duties – hunting with Joseph Trutch – Tom & Georgie Ellis arrive from Penticton – court at New Westminster – Henry Cornwall returns to Ashcroft - meeting with Indian agent George Blenkinsop and Indian Reserve Commission surveyor Henry Ashdown Green.

### SEPTEMBER

Croquet parties at the Jacksons and Maple Bank - "Carry" O'Reilly's 49<sup>th</sup> birthday – Peter takes his family on his court circuit – court at New Westminster, Yale, Lytton, Ashcroft.

### OCTOBER

Court at Kamloops is followed by hunting with Joseph Trutch – court at New Westminster – croquet at Maple Bank – at Point Ellice potatoes are dug and 500 strawberry seedlings purchased.

### NOVEMBER

Frank O'Reilly contemplates entering Charterhouse school in London – "fourth anniversary of our darling "Pops" death" – dinner parties – court at New Westminster, Yale, and Lytton.

### DECEMBER

Court at Ashcroft – four days of subzero temperatures and snow on the ground make travel difficult and cause the delay of court at Kamloops – court at Yale held, then New Westminster where Peter experiences one of heaviest caseloads while suffering from a bad cold – a quiet Christmas holiday is celebrated with Joseph & Julia Trutch – return to New Westminster to hold Court of Appeal & Revision – Kathleen "Puss" O'Reilly's 13<sup>th</sup> birthday on December 31<sup>st</sup>.

## REFERENCES & COMMENTS

1880-03-16

### **McLean brothers murder trial**

Trial of Allan, Charley, and Archie McLean and Alex Hare for the murder of John Ussher and James Kelly in 1879. All were found guilty, later retried and found guilty again, and were hanged in January 1881.

1880-03-21

### **William Ridley** (1836-1911)

First bishop of the newly created diocese of Caledonia. He was responsible for ensuring that missions under the Church Missionary Society adhere to Anglican doctrine which put him in direct conflict with missionary William Duncan at Metlakatla. Duncan was expelled from the CMS in 1881 and left for New Metlakatla with his followers in 1887. The remaining residents of the mission were left in Ridley's charge.

### **Sarah Delia (Hilman) Onderdonk** (1850-1931)

Married Andrew Onderdonk (1848-1905) in 1871.

1880-04-20

### **Andrew Onderdonk** (1848-1905)

Engineer and contractor, supervised construction on major sections of the transcontinental railway in British Columbia (1879-85). Onderdonk established his construction headquarters and home in Yale, BC while building the Port Moody to Savona's Ferry section of the line along the Fraser and Thompson Rivers. He later received the contract from the Canadian Pacific Railway Company to build the line from Savona's Ferry to Craigellachie, BC.

1880-05-29

### **Robert Paterson Rithet** (1844-1919)

Businessman and politician, partner in Welch, Rithet and Co from 1871 dealing in commission, wholesale goods, and insurance. Mayor of Victoria (1885), MLA (1894-98).

1880-05-29

### **Elizabeth Jane Hanna (Munro) Rithet** (1853-1952)

Married Robert Paterson Rithet (1844-1919) in 1875.

1880-06-02

### **William John Macdonald** (1829-1916)

Merchant and politician, twice mayor of Victoria (1866-67, 1871), served in Canadian Senate (1871-1915).

1880-06-02

### **Catherine Balfour (Reid) Macdonald** (1833-1914)

Married to William John Macdonald (1829-1916).

1880-06-17

### **Acton Windeyer Silitoe** (1840-1894)

First bishop of New Westminster diocese (1880-89).

1880-06-17

### **Violet Emily (Pelly) Silitoe** (1855-1934)

Married Acton Windeyer Silitoe (1840-1894) in 1879.

1880-07-24

### **Indian Reserve Commission** (1878-1910)

The purpose of the Commission was to allot Indian reserves, fishing stations, commonages, and water rights in British Columbia, a process which had begun under the Joint Indian Reserve Commission (1876-78). In 1880 the IRC Commissioner Gilbert Malcolm Sproat resigned after governmental and public criticism of his work thus creating a vacancy.

1880-07-29

### **comment**

Earlier in 1880 Joseph Trutch had consulted with BC Premier George Anthony Walkem and BC Superintendent of Indian Affairs Israel Wood Powell about a suitable replacement for Indian Reserve Commissioner Gilbert Sproat who had recently resigned. Trutch provided a letter of recommendation to Prime Minister John A Macdonald and by late July O'Reilly had received a letter from Powell appointing him Indian Reserve Commissioner.

**Gertrude Edith "Gertie" Powell**

(1866-1945)

Firstborn child of Israel Wood Powell and Jane (Branks) Powell, married Edward Langworthy (1867-1915) in 1898.

1880-07-31

**Amelia Eliza Mary "Nonie" Powell**

(1872-1953)

Third child and second daughter of Israel Wood Powell and Jane (Branks) Powell.

1880-08-11

**Lawrence Vankoughnet**

(1836-1898)

Deputy Superintendent General of Indian Affairs in Ottawa (1867-1893).

1880-08-31

**George Blenkinsop**

(1822-1904)

HBC employee (1840-61), worked for Joint Indian Reserve Commission (1876-78), Indian Reserve Commission (1878-79), appointed Indian agent for the Kwahkewlth agency (1881-86).

1880-08-31

**Ashdown Henry Green**

(1840-1927)

CPR surveyor (1871-80), surveyor of allotments for Indian Reserve Commission (1878-1910).

1880-11-20

**Middleton House school**

Frank O'Reilly attended a private school for boys from 1878 to 1883 run by Revd. Alfred Conder (1833-1895) which was in Conder's home, Middleton House, Bognor (Bognor Regis), Sussex.

### JANUARY

**1880-01-01**

**THURSDAY**

Cold raw day. Carry drove to town. Alice Ward returned with her. –

Remained at home expecting Thomson to drive me to Belmont but he did not come. Succeeded in getting an excellent tree, which with Willy Pinders help was adorned & decorated. = A number of visitors called.

**1880-01-02**

**FRIDAY**

Raw Cold day, drove Carry to town.

Puss had her birthday party & tree about 26 children, & 13 others came – they all appeared to enjoy themselves. A slight fall of snow.

A carriage belonging to Francis [broke] the gate & drove over the grass

**1880-01-03**

**SATURDAY**

Cold raw day – N.E. wind  
Walked to town long chat with McCreight & Ward – paid Mrs Charles a visit. Sat an hour with Forbes Vernon in Club  
Tired to see Sir Matthew, but failed.

**1880-01-04**

**SUNDAY**

Miserable day – rain & snow  
Seedy all the day, remained at home.

Carry Puss & Alice went to Church at St Johns.

**1880-01-05**

**MONDAY**

Still very seedy – remained in

bed most of day.

About 2 in. of snow on ground

**1880-01-06**

**TUESDAY**

4 Inches of snow. Song  
opened the potatoe pit, & put  
5. sacks into cellar.

Sir Matthew, Matthews and  
Bennett dined with us. He sang  
“Pinafore” –

Mrs Crease gave her ball  
at “Pentrelew with a C.”

Heavy fall of snow.

**1880-01-07**

**WEDNESDAY**

3½ ft of snow on the level,  
had roof of new building cleared  
Jack cought 17- little birds in  
the stable. Ward rode over to  
see us.

**1880-01-08**

**THURSDAY**

Frosty day – clear & bright. Sleighs  
in great demand. Remained  
at home. Carry called on Mrs  
Drake & Mrs Turner. Willy Ward  
rode over on his pony. John  
called. Letter from Frank  
to his Mother.

**1880-01-09**

**FRIDAY**

Anniversary of J.W.Ts marriage  
Terrible storm of wind &  
snow – impossible to remain  
out of doors.

**1880-01-10**

**SATURDAY**

Bright clear frosty day. Walked  
to town, posted a number of  
letters. C. Vernon drove me in  
sleigh for Thomsons cutter which  
we tied on behind & came home  
Vernon lunched. – Took  
Carry for a drive in cutter.  
Called on the Wards, all out,  
then to Fairfield.

**1880-01-11**

**SUNDAY**

Hard frost during the night  
Dull day looking like a change.  
Carry, Self, Puss & Alice went to  
St Johns = Revd Jenns officiated  
Paid Thomson a visit – afterward  
drove him to ~~Belmont~~ Maple bank  
in sleigh

**1880-01-12**

**MONDAY**

Strong wind from the S.W. rained  
incessantly all the day.  
Recd Cheque from Pearse for  
\$52.50 being the half of Petersons  
interest on Mortgage to 5<sup>th</sup> Decr.

**1880-01-13**

**TUESDAY**

Attended meeting of directors  
of Gas Co = Div. declared  
for ½ year @ [left blank] per cent.  
Recd for H. P. W. \$[left blank]  
Capt Hare 105.00  
Self 246.75  
Finlayson grumpy at  
the meeting – Handed H. P. Ws  
cheque to Ward. –  
Snow disappearing. Drove Carry to town  
Mrs Ward drove her out to lounch & then home.

**1880-01-14**

**WEDNESDAY**

Rained incessantly  
all day – could not take  
Alice home – as agreed on.  
Jemmett arrived fr N. W.  
dined & spent the evening  
with us

**1880-01-15**

**THURSDAY**

Cemetry Board interest due \$80  
Snow nearly all gone. Drove  
Alice home. Carry & Puss to town  
Attended meeting of share  
holders Loan & Investment Society  
Where a dividend of 9½ per  
cent was declared to be  
paid on Saturday.  
The Thomsons & Ward dined

with us – the latter slept.  
1870 – net profit L. & I. 21864.70

**1880-01-16**

**FRIDAY**

Wet day – ~~Ward~~ Drove Ward  
to town at 10 A.M.  
Paid some bills – home  
at 2½.

**1880-01-17**

**SATURDAY**

Wards birthday.  
Walked to town took Jack also  
Drew divs - Loan & Investment  
Society     Capt Hare \$45.00  
Jno Trutch Settlement   90.00  
Self                         344.25  
Handed Ward Capt  
Hares two cheques & got Draft in  
his favor for £30-3-8. –  
McCreight. Jemmett & Morrison  
Dined.

tell me of his troubles  
Lent him \$60

**1880-01-18**

**SUNDAY**

Fine day. Church at St  
Johns Revd Jenns officiated  
Walked to P. O.

Puss suffering fr Ear ache

**1880-01-19**

**MONDAY**

Pouring wet day. Walked to town  
with Carry – pd bills  
Paid into Bank three cheques Vis  
Div fr. Gas Co                 \$244.25  
Loan Investment             346.75  
Pearse – Peterson interest 52.50  
\$643.50

Paid to Jno Trutch acct  
\$90- his cheque fr L. & I.  
Roper dined, Jno T spent a  
couple of hours.

**1880-01-20**

**TUESDAY**

Rained heavily during the  
night. Left for N. W. in Princess  
Louise at 8- - passengers Chas  
Brodie, Roper, Hull &c  
smooth passage, lovely day  
2 hours delay at Ladners taking  
in Hay, & some of Ropers cattle  
arrived at 5- P.M. C Brodie  
came to my room fr a chat  
3 in snow on ground

**1880-01-21**

**WEDNESDAY**

Rained heavily all day  
County Court N. W. 10 AM  
Light day – finished by  
3 P.M.  
Dined with Cambie Keifer  
Major & Grey.

**1880-01-22**

**THURSDAY**

Rained heavily all night  
& throughout the day.  
Called on the Archdeacon & on  
Mrs Homer.  
Tried to see Edmonds  
several times but failed.  
Dined with Cambie &c  
Agreed with Charly Leggatt to pay  
him \$14- cash out of pocket in the  
McCormack case – instead of \$150-

**1880-01-23**

**FRIDAY**

Incessant rain – cold  
miserable day.  
Tried to get statement of  
acct fr. Edmonds but failed  
Str Princess Louise arrived  
at 3½. Recd letter fr Carry  
with enclosures fr. Puss J.W.T. &  
Harvey. – Roper came up  
Dined with Cambie &c

**1880-01-24**

**SATURDAY**

Rained all night awoke by  
a [left blank]  
Left at 8- blowing ½ gale which

increased as we neared the Gulf reached  
the pass in fair time – very sick  
The gale increased to a hurricane  
anchored at Saltspring Island fr 2  
hours. Capt Lewis says it was the strongest  
gale he ever remembered on the coast  
reached home at 6- PM – sick all day  
[overwritten text]  
Passengers Roper  
Sproat Wallace &c

**1880-01-25**

**SUNDAY**

Slight frost, cold raw day  
several short showers of snow.  
Church at St Johns – Revd Jenns  
officiated.  
Called to enquire for Mrs Turner  
& spent half an hour, also pd  
the Drakes a visit. Sir M.B.B.  
lunched. Willy P. & wife called  
but went away again without our  
seeing them.

**1880-01-26**

**MONDAY**

The horse “Joe” shod.  
Cold raw day. Drove Puss to  
school, the first day after her vacation  
Had a chat with Ward re the  
purchase of the McDonald lease  
Signed conveyance The Bishop to  
Grey Lot 11- B 34 N. W. \$200 –  
Had pig killed  
Roper called to say he could not dine  
as he leaves town fr Kamloops.  
Carry ill all day.

**1880-01-27**

**TUESDAY**

Raining all the day, cold & raw  
Roper left for Kamloops  
Kear’s man repaired hot water pipe  
in bath room & put new zink in  
sink. Smith & Clarks man  
altered the W. C. by putting in paper  
box & cupboard & brackets.  
C Brodie lunched. Eberts &  
John called.

**1880-01-28**

**WEDNESDAY**

About one inch of snow on ground  
Remained at home

**1880-01-29**

**THURSDAY**

Drove Puss to school in sleigh, &  
Carry to Mrs Wards where we stayed 2 hours.  
Then to town signed transfers of Gas shares  
to Thomson as director.  
Wrote Capt Hare enclosed 2<sup>nd</sup> exchange  
fr. £30-3-8- Asked him to get me  
£40- or £50- worth of Claret 2/3 fairly  
good dinner wine – the remainder good  
after dinner wine – to be sent if possible by  
H. B. ship. To draw on me for amt or to  
send acct when I will remit each  
Copy of letter kept.

**1880-01-30**

**FRIDAY**

Drove Puss & the Drakes to  
school. Posted letters, paid  
some bills. Home at 2½ PM.

**1880-01-31**

**SATURDAY**

Fine day at last, snow going  
away rapidly. – Keays man put  
in pipe north of bow window dining  
room. Smith & Cs man, put 2  
shelves in cupboards.  
Carry & Puss drove to town  
Dr & Mrs Ash called.  
McCreight dined.

## FEBRUARY

**1880-02-01**

**SUNDAY**

Very fine day – thawing roads  
Slushy. Church at St Johns  
Revd Jenns officiated. Holy  
Communion.  
Called to enquire fr. Mrs Thomson  
Sir M B. B. took an early  
dinner with us.

**1880-02-02**

**MONDAY**

Frosty morning. Drove  
Puss & the Drakes to school  
Had a long chat with Charles  
Attended general yearly meeting  
of shareholders M. & M. Co.  
A. Graham called while I was  
out.  
Dakota arrived at 5½  
Walked to town with Jack,  
letters not delivered.

**1880-02-03**

**TUESDAY**

Drove to town with Jack  
at 8- AM. Recd letter fr Frank  
& fr. Dewdney. – Carry drove  
the children to school.  
Remained at home worked in  
garden. Bennett called &  
lunched. Carry & I dined at  
Powells, also the Pembertons, the  
Matchels, Sir M B. B. Matthews  
Mogg.

**1880-02-04**

**WEDNESDAY**

Drove the children to school  
Paid duty on Set of harness  
fr. Lennans. Had a chat with  
Ward. –  
Unpacked harness found  
it in bad order mouldy & stuck  
together, & not what I wanted  
Collar too small – saddle too  
large. – Walked with Carry  
to enquire fr. Mrs Thomson.

**1880-02-05**

**THURSDAY**

Fine day bright & warm  
Drove the children to school  
Pruned the fruit trees.  
Mrs Lawrence & the Wards  
called. John paid us a long  
visit. – The Robertsons, the  
Johnstons, Orlibar, & Agnes McKay  
dined Agnes remained the night.

**1880-02-06**

**FRIDAY**

Fine day. Carry drove  
Puss & Agnes McKay to the  
school.  
Had the potatoes picked  
& put into the cellar.  
Morrison called & remained  
to louch.

**1880-02-07**

**SATURDAY**

Lovely day worked in garden  
Drove to town to meet Cornwall  
but missed him. He came out & took  
up his quarters with us, after dinner  
we all went to see the amatures  
play Bombastes, & Lord Lovel  
a great success.

**1880-02-08**

**SUNDAY**

Very fine day, clear & bright  
Church at St Johns. Revd Jenns  
officiated. Cornwall walked to  
Pearses, I drove for him at 2 PM  
Called at Mrs Jacksons on the way  
Ward & his boys called also Thomson  
called. Spent the evening at  
home. W. Drake paid us a visit.

**1880-02-09**

**MONDAY**

Chinese New Year  
F. J. O.R. birth day 14. -  
Splendid day. Drove Cornwall to town  
& Puss to school. Called on Cambie Keafer  
& Major. Begbie Cornwall Jackson & wife  
Ward & John dined with us.  
Settle all private accts with C. F. C.  
he paid me \$48- being 1/3 of assessment  
on Howe claim since last settlement.  
He also left me voucher fr \$54 to be  
paid by Todd the amt to be forwarded to  
Mrs C. F. C.  
[overwritten text]  
Walked to  
town with Carry  
John & the children  
paid new years  
Call on Wing Kee  
& Lady.

**1880-02-10**

**TUESDAY**

2<sup>nd</sup> day of Chinese New Year  
Glorious day. Drove Cornwall to  
Esquimalt, he left in the Dakota  
Cambie & Keefer also. Jack accompanied  
Walked over the Coffey dam with the  
Vernons Houghton & Layton. All of  
whom afterwards pd us a short visit  
Worked in Garden

**1880-02-11**

**WEDNESDAY**

Cold raw day – remained  
at home pruned the fruit trees.  
Ward paid us a visit  
Recd letter fr Elliott in re  
advance of \$200 to enable  
him to proceed to England.

**1880-02-12**

**THURSDAY**

Welch Rithet ½ yrs interest \$225- due  
Worked in garden.  
Carry & self dined at  
the Wards, no one but ourselves  
Cold raw day – blowing half  
a gale  
Smith & Clarks man  
put new gutter in stable.

**1880-02-13**

**FRIDAY**

Carry drove Puss to school  
& did not return till 2¾ O.C.  
Rained heavily, & blew a gale  
during the night – the roof  
of our house leaked like a  
sieve.

**1880-02-14**

**SATURDAY**

Cold wintry day. Drove  
Puss & Jack to town – being  
Valentine's day they invested  
their bits. Had a chat with  
Ward McCreight – presented  
Cornwall voucher for \$52.50  
to Todd which he promised to  
remit to me.  
McCreight Bennett & Jemmett  
dined with us.

[*overwritten text*]

Redgrave called  
Lent him \$40- which  
with \$22 previously advanced  
made \$62 fr which  
took his note

**1880-02-15**

**SUNDAY**

Cold raw day.  
Church at St Johns  
Revd Jenns officiated.  
Walked to the Post Office - no  
English letters.  
Sir M.B.B. paid us a visit

**1880-02-16**

**MONDAY**

Ton of coal delivered by Engelhardt  
Hard frost during the night  
Smith & Clark measured fence & gates  
& afterwards offered to do the work fr \$200  
which I refused. Paid their bill \$3- extra  
for their plan of gates &c.  
Saw Elliott in re his request to borrow  
\$200. – John spent the evening.

**1880-02-17**

**TUESDAY**

Left fr. N. W. pr Princess Louise at 8. AM  
Went to relic of St California near  
Albert Head & after much difficulty  
towed her to smooth water at mt  
of harbor, then steamed to Esquimalt  
for the "Otter". Very rough passage  
to N W, great difficulty in finding the  
buoys at mt river, thick weather snow  
Reached N. W. at 6½. Raymur Jack  
Grey & self dined together

**1880-02-18**

**WEDNESDAY**

County Court N. W. 10- A.M.  
In Court till 7 PM, & adjourned  
till 10 A.M. tomorrow  
Bole dined with me.  
About 15 inches of snow

**1880-02-19**

**THURSDAY**

Cold raw day. In Court  
till 7- P.M.

**1880-02-20**

**FRIDAY**

Frost. Bright clear day.  
Saw Edmonds in re leasing  
66 ft of lot on Front St to Capt Irving  
& D. Chisholm decided to offer it at  
\$60 pr m. for 10 yrs all taxes to be
