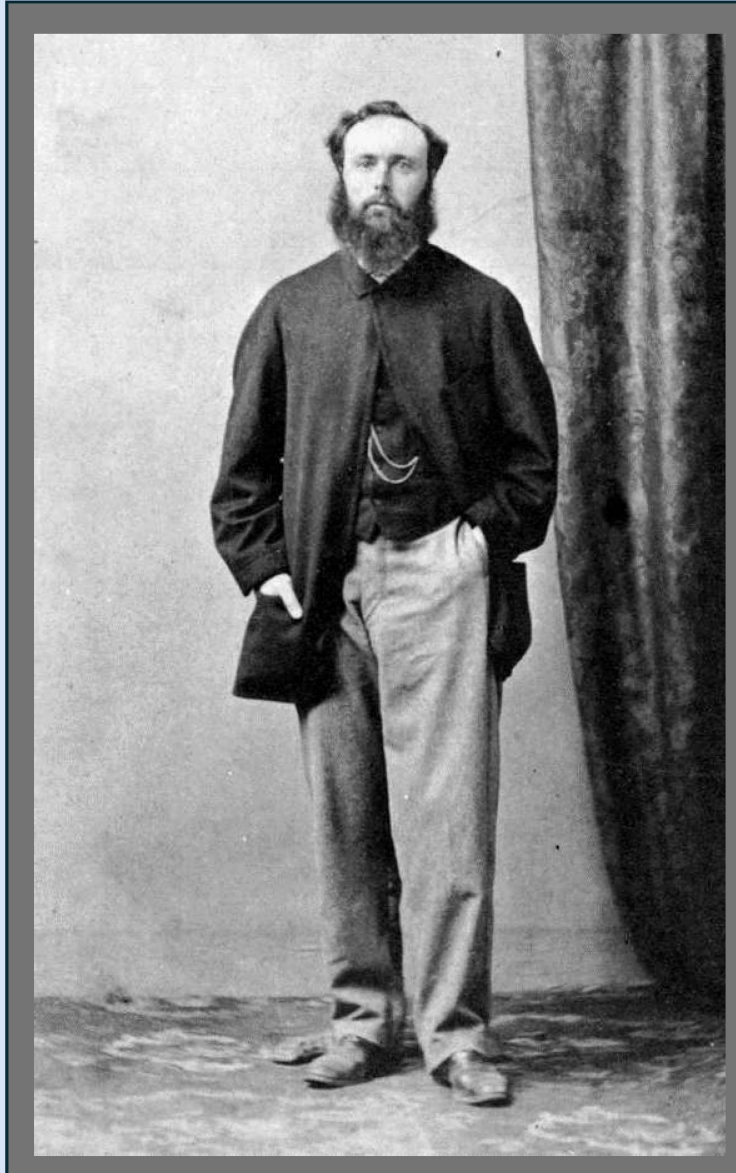

FOREWORD

Peter O'Reilly's 1863 diary has been voluntarily transcribed for informational purposes only. Researchers interested in this diary are advised to consult the original document housed at the Royal British Columbia Museum & Archives, found in MS-2894, the O'Reilly family fonds.

TRANSCRIPTION NOTES

Each year's transcription includes a brief diary summary for each month. A reference and comments section is also provided to identify people, places, events, or things mentioned in the diaries. Comments, where provided, are discretionary and are given when it appears helpful to the understanding of the diary contents. The existence of a reference or comment within the diary is indicated by an asterisk beside the diary date. Multiple asterisks indicate multiple references or comments for the same date.

Square brackets are used to denote transcriptionist comments. Best guesses of words or phrases appearing in the text are enclosed in square brackets and not italicized, while functional comments about the text are italicized. The following are examples of functional comments.

[*illegible*] – a word cannot be read.

[*deletion*] – a strikethrough cannot be read.

[*no entry*] – no entry in the diary for that date.

[*left blank*] – a space reserved for text entry.

[*overwritten text*] – text written over the top of other text.

[*loss*] – text that is too faint to read.

[*missing*] – microfilmed diary does not contain that date.

Spelling inconsistency is commonly found and is usually not corrected from the original, however, letters are occasionally inserted in square brackets to clarify the understanding of an otherwise misspelled word.

Deleted words and sentences are included and struck through where legible.

Marriage of Peter O'Reilly and Caroline Trutch.
December 15, 1863

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 15, 1863.

Beautiful bright frost day with a slight sprinkling of snow. Carriage arrived at 11. Started with Barnaby & Langston at 11 1/2 & reaches the Church at 11 1/2. Marriage Ceremony before 12. (4th) Set down to Breakfast at 1. P.M. ~~At~~ which passed off very well. Left Fairfield at 4 1/2 reached Belmont at 6. Found the home very comfortable. M^{rs} Ruby in attendance.

WEDNESDAY 16

Heavy fall of snow during the night. Both Cary & myself suffering from Colds. Remained in house all day.

THURSDAY 17

Heavy rain. Webster went to town, brought back a load of stores &c also "Ponto" my gun. Cary's cold somewhat better. Mine, very much worse, with bad sore throat & loss of voice. Much fruit & potatoes &c the order of the day.

DIARY SUMMARY

JANUARY

Remaining in Victoria, Peter O'Reilly meets with Gov. Douglas - attends dances, church, theatre, and visits friends - helps to organize Bachelor Ball and attends the Ball – visits frequently with the Trutch family.

FEBRUARY

Discussions regarding changes to the mining law with Gov. Douglas - Douglas promotes Peter to position of Gold Commissioner with increased salary – Peter becomes member of Freemasons of Victoria.

MARCH

Office work continues while in Victoria. - days pass without a diary entry.

APRIL

Peter departs Victoria to return to Cariboo traveling by way of Hope, Lytton, and Lillooet – issues mining certificates, licences, and records lots while at Williams Lake - continues writing numbered letters to “Mamsey” Ellis in Ireland and commences writing to Caroline Trutch in Victoria.

MAY

Travel to Quesnelle Mouth (Quesnel), Cottonwood, and Van Winkle - Williams Creek courthouse in disarray - headaches persist and work difficult - cold weather and frequent snow.

JUNE

A “tremendous rush” for mining certificates, trading licences, and land records keep Peter busy - invests \$1000 with 7% interest - weather turns hot with several strong thunderstorms.

JULY

Money is raised by subscription to build a new church – Peter lends money to others - continues to write and receive letters from Caroline Trutch in Victoria and Mamsey in Ireland.

AUGUST

New church building opens - enters 57 new cases in county court – Mamsey is informed of the unlikelihood of Peter's return to Ireland - first snowfall of season occurs August 16th – Peter attends three lectures about the fate of the 1845 Franklin Expedition.

SEPTEMBER

Ten members of mining board elected - an escort travels to Victoria with \$100,000 worth of gold - Peter's request for a leave of absence starting October 1st is approved.

OCTOBER

A month-long return trip to Victoria commences – Peter hunts for “Prairie Chickens”, ducks and grouse along the way - “Origon Jack” sentenced to two years hard labour for breaking out of Richfield jail.

NOVEMBER

Back in Victoria and situated at the “French” Hotel, Peter frequently meets, socializes, and dines with Gov. Douglas – attends theatre and social events with the Trutches - horse “Tom” dies – temporary appointment as Stipendiary Magistrate for Vancouver Island during illness of Joseph Pemberton.

DECEMBER

Marriage of Peter O'Reilly and Caroline Trutch on December 15th at Christ Church in Victoria - following the ceremony they travel to Belmont near Victoria both suffering from bad colds.

Fairfield

Home of Joseph and Julia Trutch in Victoria from 1861 until her death in 1895 and his return to England in 1896. The estate surrounding the house was divided into building lots in 1903. Pictured are members of the Trutch and O'Reilly families.

1863-04-08

Steamer *Reliance*

Steamship built for Captain William Irving in Victoria in 1862 for the New Westminster to Yale route on the Fraser River.

1863-04-14

comment

Peter starts a sequence of numbered letters to "T" and later "C" who is most likely Caroline Trutch in Victoria.

1863-04-17

John W White

(? - ?)

Constable, clerk, postmaster in the Columbia district (1863-69).

1863-05-10

John Cameron

(1820-1888)

Founder of the Cameron Claim, one of the largest operations in the Cariboo district.

1863-08-27

David Walker

(1837-1917)

Irish surgeon and naturalist on the Fox Arctic Expedition of 1857-59 that established the fate of Sir John Franklin's 1845 search for the Northwest Passage.

1863-08-31

Barkerville, BC

Main town of the Williams Creek gold rush area in the Cariboo district along with Cameronton and Richfield, founded in 1862.

1863-10-12

William Henry Fitzgerald

(c. 1835-1873)

Chief constable in Cariboo West (1863-70), later served as gold commissioner and stipendiary magistrate for the Omineca district.

1863-11-21

"Carry"

Nickname for Charlotte Agnes Trutch.

1863-11-30

comment

Peter O'Reilly is appointed Stipendiary Magistrate for Vancouver Island on a temporary basis.

1863-12-15

comment

A speech apparently written by Peter O'Reilly on the occasion of his marriage to Caroline Trutch is contained in the NOTES section.

1863-12-15

Belmont

Home of Chief Justice David Cameron built in 1853 on the west side of Esquimalt Harbour, now the site of Fort Rodd Hill.

NOTES

Ladies & Gentlemen

I feel inadequate to the task of thanking you for the kind feelings expressed for my wife & myself & I need not say how gratifying it is on such an occasion an eventful & happy occasion to find myself surrounded by so many old & valued friends - I sincerely hope that the feelings of friendship always subsisting between us in my Bachelorhood may be if possible further increased by seeing you all as often as circumstances will permit under our "Mahogany" - I again on the part of my wife & myself give our best thanks for such good wishes & assure some that the kind sentiments expressed are most sincerely appreciated by both of us -

In conclusion I may perhaps express the hope that my Bachelor friends I see around me may be at some future time in a similar position, & likewise to assure them, that their good wishes for our happiness to day will best be more heartfelt than our own for theirs on a similar occasion

Lunch at the French with Ball & Jno Trutch Capt Spencer, & Cochrane went with Jno Trutch to hunt up [subscriptions] to a proposed Bachelors

Ball. The Bishop arrived fr N. W. Palmer arrived per Enterprise, he & Jno Trutch dined with me at St George, went with him to [Billiard] saloon home at AM 1-½ sat up chatting till 3- Recd letter fr J. G.

1863-01-10

SATURDAY

Fine day for a wonder, breakfast with Luff at the French, went with Jno Trutch to hunt up subscriptions for the Ball. Rode Roberts horse on trial, with Ball Begbie, Mathew, & the Trutches. Dined at Burnaby's - very jolly evening, home at AM 1½ Chat with Palmer. Turned in at 3. A.M.

1863-01-11

SUNDAY

Fine day. Palmer & self breakfast at the French. Church at Christ's Mr Cridge read service & Preached - lunch at the Governors, called on the Youngs - Dined at the French with Palmer, & went to St Johns at 7- O.C. home at 11-

1863-01-12

MONDAY

Breakfast at the French. Went with Palmer to have our likeness taken. Palmer went to Esquimault. In town most of day with Jno Trutch making arrangements for the Ball. Dined with Begbie at the St George - 16 sat down pleasant evening - home at 12- O.C. Poor Porter died at 3- O.C. this morning

1863-01-13

TUESDAY

Most of day in Court in waiting to gin evidence in the Laurence case. Attended a meeting of the Committee to make arrangts for Bachelors Ball - day fixed Friday 23rd invitations sent up to Camp & New Westminster

1863-01-14

WEDNESDAY

Up early. Palmer left in the Enterprise for N. W. Porter buried good attendance In Court nearly all day to give evidence in the Laurence murder case - [*deletion*]

Siera Nevad arrived at 4 P.M.

Recd No 21- fr. dearest Mamsey & Posted No 1- Dined at Trutches & went with them & Careys to C's lecture. Walked home with them. Did not turn in till 2 AM

THURSDAY

Fine morning. In office with H. E. till 2- Paid visit at Trutches & to the Bishop. Dined at Youngs house at 10½ - Begbie called & remained till 2- AM, very tired

1863-01-16

FRIDAY

Busy with H. E. till 11- O.C. Attended meeting & finally arranged with Ben Dixon about the Ball. Enterprise arrived at 2- P.M. The Col. Grant Crease & Trutch came down Dined at the French with the Trutches & went to Dundas' Childrens tea Party Walked home & spent the evening at Trutches. Home at 12-

Up at 10- Falty & self breakfasted in my room, occupied with H. E. & Crease till 4- Took a stroll on Beacon hill. Dined at the French, & went to the Theater with Seddal not home till 12- very tired and sleepy

1863-01-25

SUNDAY

Lovely day. Christs Church at 11- Sermon by the Bishop in aid of the distressed operatives Called on the Gov, Mrs Young & Good Remained in my room fr hours in very low spirits The ship Princess Royal arrived having made the journey in 134 days - about 30 days over her average time.

Paid Edwards \$11-75- the amt of meat bill fr. Plomer at Beaver pass

Up at 6- Wrote to Luard Grant Sanders Charles Dewdney & Gompertz Enterprise left for N W at 9- AM. Unpacked my box & found everything in good order.

1863-01-31

SATURDAY

In office nearly all day
Dined with Col. Moody P. & Falty & went to the Woods where we danced till 12 OC.

FEBRUARY

1863-02-01

SUNDAY

Fine day Service at Christs Church Sermon by the Bishop - Holy Communion. Walked home with the Trutches - dined at St Nicholas - with the Colonel P. & Falty - went to St Johns at 7-

1863-02-02

MONDAY

Engaged with Crease & H E with reference to the mining laws. Called for Mrs Young & paid a round of visits with her. Col Moody P. & Falty dined with me at the French. Afterwards paid the Woods a visit & remained till 11-

1863-02-03

TUESDAY

This day four years I left home Would to God I was back again.

1863-02-04

WEDNESDAY

Amt due me by Armstrong [Sherred] & Nesbit \$83-25- Nesbit paid his proportion 27-75
Sailed from Galway
this day four years. When shall I be able to return?

Recd Nos 22 & 23- Posted No 2 & enclosed Begbies Certificate & 1. Carte de Visite of self. Bad head ache
Falty, P. Joe & Mrs Trutch left in the Siera nevada for Frisco. Called on Walker who returned from Frisco today - found him looking very seedy - dined with him & Begbie home early, & turned in at 11-
Paid Falty the \$100- borrowed for him on the 29th letter Recd for W A G Y \$100. which I gave to P. to buy a safe at Frisco

1863-02-06

FRIDAY 6

Very cold morning about 2 inches of snow Enterprise arrived from N. W. at 3- Luard came down in her. Letters for Sanders Cox & Charles. - Luard took up his quarters with me & I dined at the French & had a long chat.
Turned in at 1- AM.

1863-02-07

SATURDAY

Cold morning about 3 inches of snow & a slight frost. Luard & self breakfasted at the French busy in office till 3- Luard Jno Trutch Commodore Spencer & self dined at the French - Went to the Theater "A regular sell" turned in at 1- AM.

1863-02-08

SUNDAY

Cold morning snow & had frost breakfast at the French with Luard. Christs Church at 11- Service read by Mr Cridge. Sermon by the Archdeacon. Called on H E & the Youngs, also at Trutches who

were out. Dined with Luard at H. E.
turned in at 11-

1863-02-09

MONDAY

Very hard frost. Luard & self breakfast
at the French. Luard spent the day at
Esquimalt & dined at Burnabys
In office all day with H. E. &
Crease with reference to the mining
laws, but very little done.
Luard and self dined at Youngs
& spent a pleasant evening

1863-02-10

TUESDAY

Cold raw morning. Luard &
self breakfasted at the Colonial
Closeted again with H. E.
Luard spent the day at Esquimalt
& dined at Burnaby's. Dined at the
St George with Spencer, Begbie Ball &
Walker, home at 8- & wrote letters
till Luard came home 11½.

Recvd \$67 in full [illegible]

The above is the balance borrowed fr
Begbie at Cariboo, for which he still
holds my I.O.U. Forwarded to Sanders
\$100- for Walker, per Reece. Luard
Gompertz & Walker left for N. W. in
the Enterprise at 9 A.M.
Busy with Crease till 3- OC
Went into town

Heavy fall of snow - a good deal of
sleighting but could not get out.
Burnaby & Franklyn (Lumley) dined
with me at the French. Afterwards attended
meeting of the Free Masons, & became a
member of that Fraternity
Stood wine at the Colonial to the
tune of \$9- (like a fool)

1863-02-13

FRIDAY

Hard frost some snow fell during
the night. The entire day in

consultation with H. E. - dined in
own room, remained at home
& spent a most lonely evening.

1863-02-14

SATURDAY

Snow disappearing fast.
In office till 3 P.M. Called on
Mrs Young, & Mrs Helmcken
Dined alone, afterwards
walked to the St George, & went
to the Theatre with Ball & Young
Hill of the Topaze.

1863-02-15

SUNDAY

Very sloppy day. Walked with
Jno Work for an hour at the back
of Gov buildings. Church at 11-
Service read by the Archdeacon
Sermon by the Bishop - lunched
with the Governor & had a long chat
Called at Trutches late & dined there
Home at 10½

1863-02-16

MONDAY

Long chat with H E - in which he
expressed his satisfaction of my services
& intended to promote me to Gold Commissioner
with increased salary. Walked into Town
paid some bills. Recd my pay for
Jany from Good - £41//13//4- \$201-8.00
Paid Judson Young \$40- on acct of
Lot - leased from the Governor. Dined with
Begbie, at St George - Ball, Forbes, & Seymour
English mail - Recd No 24

In office till 4- went out for a short ride with the Trutches, Mail steamer arrived at 8½ PM

Remained in house nearly all day dined with Nailor & McTavish at the French - Service at St Johns at 7- Sermon by Mr Wood.

1863-02-23

In the office till 6- PM - getting the mining rules passed Took a short walk with Mr & Mrs Young. Turned in to blankets at 11- Enterprise left fr. N. W. at 10- OC AM - wrote to Luard, & sent him some bacon & Sausages fr. Heywood & ordered Henrys fr Baileys to be sent per E. Anderson.

1863-02-24

TUESDAY

Beautiful morning up at 7- A number of men called to get information with reference to Silver mines Enterprise [*left blank*]

1863-02-25

WEDNESDAY

Fine bracing day. In office till 5- P.M. Dined at Mrs Rhodes, played Whist, & had some Music & singing, spent a very jolly evening. Charles called & had a long wa wa with him.

1863-02-26

THURSDAY

Beautiful day. In office till 3- P.M. took a short walk. Dined at the barracks with Smith, Burnaby L. Franklin & Dr Bogs. Afterwards adjourned to the Lodge where I passed my 3rd degree. Stood wine at the Colonial - home at 12- O.C.

1863-02-27

FRIDAY

In office Enterprise left for N. W. wrote to Luard. Charles called. He & Jno Work dined with me at the French Afterwards went to the Theater Amature Theatricals - not very good - Godfrey Brown & Rushton played very well.

1863-02-28

SATURDAY

In office till 12- took a long walk with H. E. & lunched with him afterwards called on Mrs Pemberton, met Mrs & Mr Wood & walked with them to Mrs Pearce

MARCH

1863-03-01

SUNDAY

Rained heavily all day. Christ Church at 11- Service by Sheepshanks Sermon by the Bishop. Walked home with H. E. & had a long chat afterwards - paid Mrs Young a visit. Pringle arrived per Str Enterprise.

1863-03-02

MONDAY

Busy in office with H. E. & Young Went into town & got \$48- at Wells Fargo fr. Cox to be sent to Mrs [*illegible*] [*deletion*] Cox, Kingston Ireland being \$2- less than was advised of. Got orders for £9//14//2- in favour of Mrs Cox - Walked about town with Charles Dined at the Trutches with Charles, & Jno Work.
Recd fr Gompertz £20- or \$97- which I paid to Begbie on Elwyns acct to Barker

1863-03-03

TUESDAY

In consultation with H. E. & Mr Young in reference to the Establish-ment of a Gold escort. H. E. offered me the command. Dined with the Governor & went to the Theater with him & Young to see the Panorama Str Enterprise left for N. W. at 9 AM Enclosed to Cox & sent by Express 2nd & 3 of Exchange drawn in favour of Mrs Cox, wrote to Luard Fin, & Gompertz.

1863-03-04

WEDNESDAY

Ker bought Lot [*left blank*] fr. \$250- for me. Ball & Self had an interview with Mr Young in reference to an increase of pay & allowances for the Cariboo officials Enterprise returned fr N. W. letters fr Luard

In office till 3- O.C. Walked about Town with Ball, & dined with him at the St George - afterwards attended meeting of Lodge home at 10½
